




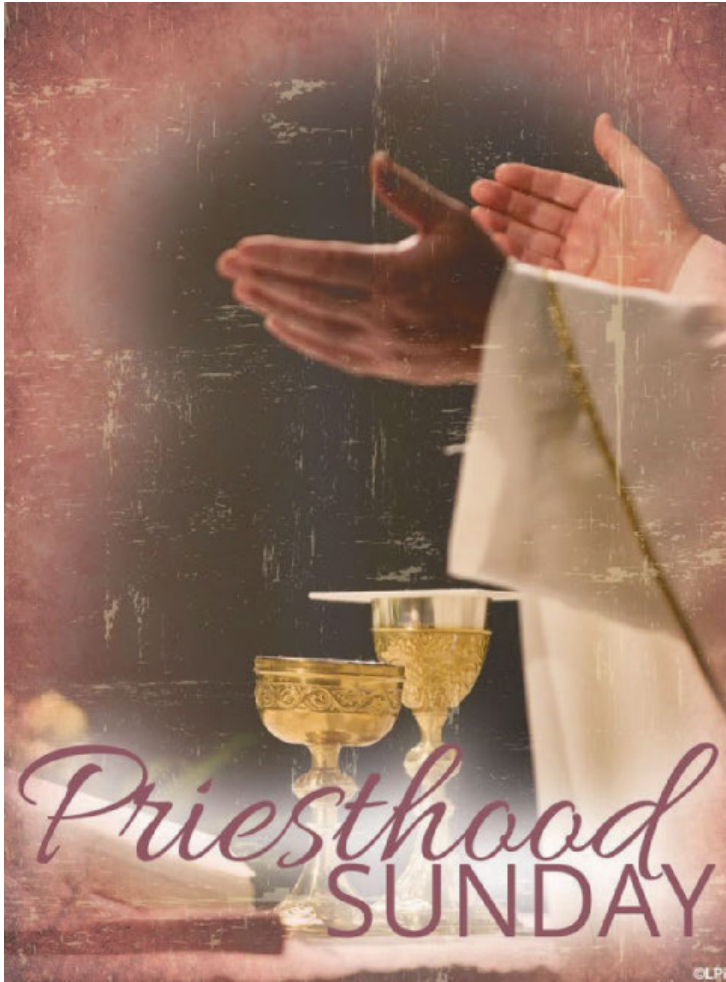

Greetings from the Social Justice Committee:

Share your harvest: There is a small cart in the gathering area where you can share your produce. If you have extra, leave it, and if you can use it, please take it. It is one small way we can take care of each other.

Coat Collection: From mid-September to mid-October, we will be collecting gently used coats for the community. This can be men's, women's or children's coats. There should be no rips or holes, and the buttons and zippers should work so the coat can be closed. Please leave them in the bins near the entrances, and we will distribute them around the community. Thank you.

PASTORAL THOUGHTS...

Last June, a few parishes from Wisconsin Rapids took a group of students to CrossWoods Adventure Camp located halfway between Drummond and Delta in Bayfield County in the Diocese of Superior. The camp hosted multiple parishes from across our diocese bringing students who normally wouldn't see each other together. This trip open to high school and middle school students had a theme of adventure emphasized during our time there. At a superficial look, the sense of adventure for our week at camp was found in canoeing, rock climbing or hiking. Admittedly, I had a fantastic time with the outdoor activities and did get quite involved at times, but the most profound theme of "Adventure" was found when looking inwardly at our own spiritual growth.



I first began looking at the week from this perspective by listening to the vocational call for every priest attending the retreat. They had their own experience with Christ upon entering the seminary, but they were brought to the same priesthood despite their differences. In a relatively analogous way, each student came to the camp with different upbringings and experiences in their faith. The retreat began by acknowledging that the most important aspect of their week would be opening our hearts to Christ even if there wasn't any or much of a foundation going into it. Yet, there was a union present during prayer and worship in celebrating the mass, praying the Liturgy of the Hours or spending time in silence with the Blessed Sacrament.

It was quite fitting for the retreat to end with a vocational call as students were asked to stand if they were open to discerning religious life. There was a sense of apprehension initially, but more and more students stood up to receive a blessing for guidance in their discernment. Seeing everyone stand changed my view when praying for vocations as it shows that the youth in our pews may very well be part of that call as well.

Even though this camp doesn't reflect the average person's typical week, it should still be emulated in our lives. The camp began by asking us to be open with our neighbors and concluded with asking Christ to show us the Adventure he has planned for us.

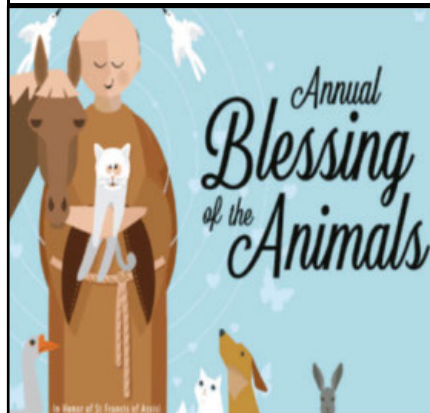
