




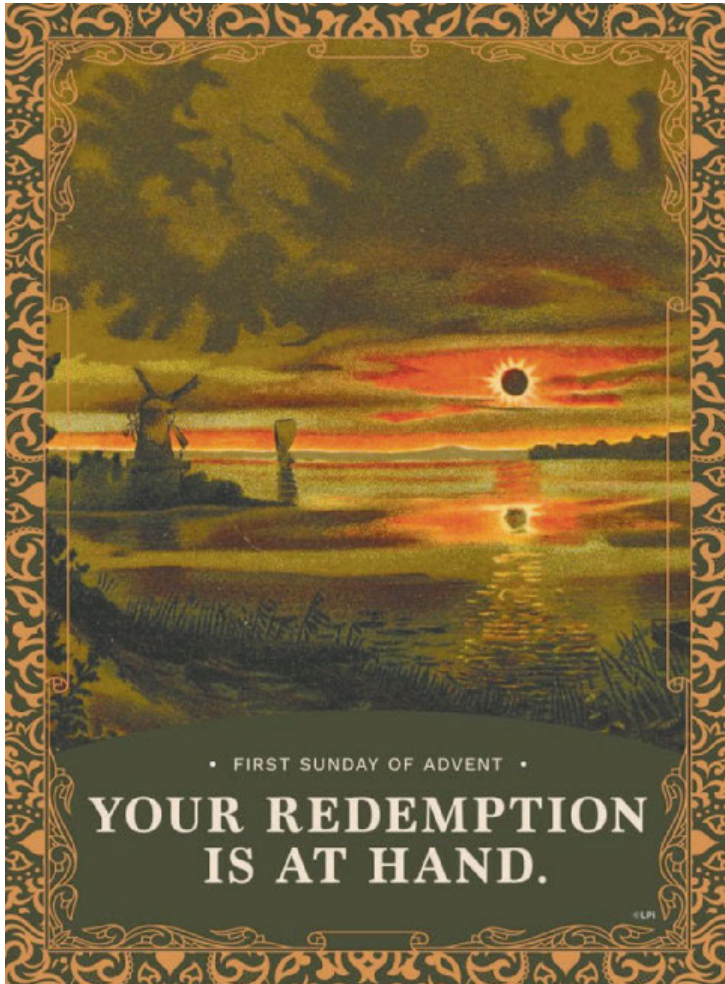

Immaculate Conception: December 9, 2024

In past years, when the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception (December 8) fell on the Second Sunday of Advent, the Immaculate Conception was transferred to Monday, December 9, but the obligation to attend Mass did not transfer. After a recent clarification from the Vatican, this will no longer be the case: rather, the obligation will also transfer. Consequently, on Monday, December 9, 2024, the Church will celebrate the Immaculate Conception and be a holy day of obligation in the Dioceses of the United States. **HOWEVER**, given the short notice of this change, and the fact that parish calendars and Mass schedules are already in place, Bishop Gerard Battersby has dispensed the faithful from this obligation in 2024. Nonetheless, at the direction of the bishop, we will have a Mass here at OLQH at 8:00 AM to celebrate the patroness of the United States. The bishop asks those who are unable to attend Mass to do some form of extra prayer, particularly praying the Rosary with at least one other person in community.

Liturgical Note: As we now bring up the gifts at Mass, the congregation should remain **seated** when the priest says the “Blessed are you, Lord” prayers and **stand** when the priest says “Pray, brethren, that my sacrifice and yours...”.

PASTORAL THOUGHTS...

I like to read the Scripture readings for tomorrow's Mass in my Magnificat each evening. I also read through the meditations and lives of the saints for that day.

The other day, the Magnificat had a commentary on Psalm 29 that really struck me. It read: "In C. S. Lewis' book *The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe*, the children are told of Aslan that 'he's not a tame lion.' Like Aslan, our God is not a tame God. He is kind and wonderful, rich in mercy, but he is at the same time awesome in majesty. The total otherness of God inspires fear, but at the same time it inspires love and wonder in us. The fear of the Lord is not a bad thing, but is rather the appropriate response of the limited creature to the unlimited goodness of God."

Just a few pages later, Professor Anthony Esolen wrote a commentary on the *Now I lay me down to sleep* prayer. He wrote: "The first part of the prayer is a wonderfully concentrated act of faith, hope, and love. But that comes after our initial act of adoration. We say we are prostrate before the majesty of God. That is more than a nod of the head or a bow, more even than falling to our knees. It means that we lay ourselves flat, face to the earth, giving ourselves up completely to God. Let's not stand on our dignity here. Man, said Chesterton, is that creature who is taller when he kneels. Then he is a perfect tower when he lies prostrate before God; at least, when we say this prayer, we can let our forehead touch the floor."

I was struck with our "untamed" God who is rich in mercy but also awesome in majesty. The only way we should approach God is in humility, in "giving ourselves up completely to God" as Prof. Esolen says. When we hear the powerful words of Psalm 29—*The God of glory thunders. In his temple they all cry: "Glory!" The Lord sits as king for ever.*—we should fall to our knees (at least spiritually) and remember, as G.K. Chesterton said, we are taller when we kneel.


