


Dear FOCUS Volunteers,

PASTORAL THOUGHTS...

Scared of the Dark

I have been really enjoying the TOTS ministry (Theology of the Storyteller) that I have been leading these several weeks. Many are coming, all ages and backgrounds, and I hope many more come for January 26 and February 9 to find solace in tater tots, fellowship, prayer, and certainly the beauty in



watching movies. During my research for the last session on Star Wars, however, after wrestling with Providence and destiny, I stumbled upon a quote from Plato, a highly influential pagan philosopher. Here is the quote: "We can easily forgive a child who is afraid of the dark; the real tragedy of life is when men are afraid of the light." I must admit that it came providentially; it came to me exactly as the Church had prayed at Mass with Christ as light during Christmas and Epiphany.

It should strike us that children are scared of the dark because of their innocence. The dark hidden things of this world are twisted and bent upon harm; and children intuitively know that they are not made for that. Yet spiritually, we grown ups are equally afraid of the light, or rather uncovering the things that are unknown within us, the things that we never really looked at deeply. In our guilt and imperfection, we fear being really known. We know this to be true whenever we reflect on our intuitive reluctance to go to Confession or to admit a wrong or to really focus in prayer on what God wants us to do. Being honest and living in the light is difficult. Perhaps this is why children naturally make stories where the "bad guys" get punished, but we adults love stories like Star Wars when "bad guys" get a second chance. Children love justice because they are innocent, we love mercy because we are guilty.

So I invite you to reflect on the fear of the light. It is when as children, we first try to hide something from our parents. It is the broken cookie jar and the refusal to fess up. It is also the precise moment when Adam and Eve's eyes were opened after they ate the fruit; they saw the world differently and hid. They transformed in that moment from ones who would have feared the dark to the ones who fear the light. Hiding has not done much for us but make us darker and more cynical. But as any Catholic knows after Confession, shining light in those dark places feels good; we are not meant to hide all that stuff down there deep in our soul, but we are meant to bring it to His Light. Be honest, but more importantly, be honest with God.
