



PASTORAL THOUGHTS...

What is a Hero?

I recently completed my Theology of the Storyteller (TOTS) ministry for Star Wars: The Original Trilogy. It was a blast and fueled a lot of good discussion. Perhaps the most pressing lesson upon me, however, is that of learning what it means to be a hero. And in Star Wars, we learn what a



hero is by learning what a Jedi is. It is a subtle point, but very important, and therefore by being an important subtle point, simplifying it can be tempting. For example, it is far too tempting to simply say that a Jedi (or any hero) is just the guy who comes in and saves people. Or similarly to say that a Jedi is the guy who puts others first, or is compassionate, or hones his incredible abilities for the good of others. Now, while all of those points are important, and certainly essential to a Jedi (or any hero), none of them is what makes a hero a hero.

It seems to me that the point of The Original Trilogy is not the simple point that a hero is a generic good person who finds compassion or serves others. No, it is far deeper, and this is why these movies so timelessly remain with us. It is not that Luke becomes a "good guy" by "saving others" but rather, it is that he is saved. It is not that he is effectively and competently doing a whole lot of things; it is more that things happen to him. Don't get me wrong, Luke does a lot of active things, but there is something incredibly passive about Luke Skywalker. For being a hero, he is constantly being saved! His New Hope world (the first movie of saving the day) is flipped upside down in the rest of the trilogy. In Empire Strikes Back (the second movie). Luke crashes to have his ship rescued by Yoda and has to be rescued from a failed attack on the dreaded Darth Vader. In Return of the Jedi (the third movie), Luke comes to save his friends, but ends up captured, escaping by reliance upon his many friends. Finally, in his greatest moment, he is saved in his fight against the big bad guy, the Emperor! He beats the bad guy by being saved by Darth Vader!

These movies are so timeless because they touch on a timeless spiritual truth. That truth is that one must be saved before one does saving: heroes need as much saving as they save others. It is the same with all the greatest saints: people remember Mother Teresa rescuing thousands of people from death on the streets, but not many remember her prayerful hours every day before the holy Eucharist. St. Francis did a lot of things to change the hearts of others, but he spent countless hours as a humble servant to God in prayer. As saints save others, they do just as much time being saved by God. And it is easy to get lost in the ministry of "saving others." As an old depressive adage goes for worn-out priests, "Jesus, I used to love you, but now I just work for you," which is a bad place to be in. Luke has a hard time in the movies because he wants to go save the day, but that is not what a Jedi is about. A Jedi is firstly a servant of the Force; he is not firstly a savior. A true hero is first held in the arms of the Master, an instrument accustomed to the Master's craft and care. If we are overwhelmed by the obligations of religious observance or evangelization, then such are good indicators that we need more prayer. We need to be consumed by the Eucharist if we are to be consumed with his work. We need to be seen by God before we can look with his love on others.




