



"Need help filing your income taxes? The AARP Tax Aide Program was designed to provide free assistance for low to middle-income taxpayers, with special attention to those age 60 and older. Volunteer counselors, trained in cooperation with the IRS will be available every Monday, Wednesday and select Thursdays through April 9 (8:00 am until 3 pm) at the Lowell Center.

Appointments are necessary! Call 715-422-2778 between the hours of 10:00 am and 1:00 pm, Monday through Friday, to schedule your personal tax appointment. Appointments will be determined on a first-call, first-serve basis. As a reminder, although this is a free service, donations are appreciated and greatly benefit Lowell Senior Center programming."

Lenten Regulations:

- 1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
- 2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted

PASTORAL THOUGHTS...

Rabbits

"Father, why this big fuss about being Catholic? Can't I just believe in my heart that Jesus is Lord? Do I need to be Catholic to be saved?" I have heard it all, folks. I find these inquiries at first funny, honestly, because people say it to a celibate priest who has literally given up his entire life for Jesus in the Catholic



Church. I do not like answering the guestion ("do I really need to be Catholic?") because I really think at that point, the person asking the question doesn't really know what life is about. Now, please do not misunderstand; my sadness at the question comes not because that person is thinking of leaving (which is sad in itself), but because that person has become a bit less human by asking the question. It is like when a child lies the first time; a line has been crossed, and the soul has violated itself. The person asking the question has in an instant become uninterested in what reality is. Men and women wonder at the universe and investigate and believe that the Earth revolves around the Sun; and regardless of how this helps us day to day, we believe it because it is true. Likewise with our beliefs about toads and taxes and everything else that is not useful or even burdensome, we believe things because they are true. Most of us don't get anything out of knowing that toads are amphibians; of course, we don't get anything out of that belief except the satisfaction of knowing that it is true. Indeed, that is what we are made for. We are not made for lies.

And so I come back to the question, and why we should flee it. I tell you to flee it, not because I think that Protestantism is wrong or that any other religion is wrong (of course I think they are incorrect; I gave my whole life to Catholicism and truly believe it to be correct!). No, I tell everyone to flee the question because the asking of the question makes one less than a man or a woman. It turns one into a rabbit, so to speak. For true men and women seek things and believe them because they are true, not because they are convenient or give us something. The person asking about needing Catholicism to be saved is the person who has heard and investigated and is now on the brink of the great door behind which is the greatest mystery of all. The opening of this door would cause a whole lot of trouble, inconvenience, and in short, the awful work of salvation; but to avoid this terrible trouble, to refuse to open the door and peek behind it, that is a tragedy. Men and women open doors and look, rabbits look for carrots and hide in holes. I personally, like most, can tolerate people that I think are in error who sincerely believe what they thought about. But I doubt many will seriously tolerate people in dishonest error; and furthermore, what will God tolerate in heaven? Surely not rabbits, for he came to save humanity. Christ tells us that the truth will set us free. And there is a bit of rabbit in each of us, that part of us that cowards at the door of truth, that cowards at just how much we fall short, how we prioritize our own reality over God's reality, of desiring salvation without the savior, of loving what we think more than what God thinks, of loving rabbit holes more than truth. And opening that door, throwing ourselves into that impossible reality called Catholicism, God will rip that fur right off of us, until this Lent, we become true men and women. Seek the truth, don't hide.
