Memorial Day – originally known as Decoration Day – was established to honor those fallen in battle during our nation's Civil War. However, today Memorial Day honors those who have died in the wars that have taken place since. We owe these fallen heroes – and the families who mourn them – our gratitude for their sacrifice and our prayers for their eternal repose.

To recall to our memory those who have died in war means also to commit ourselves to the cause for which they died. To honor their memory, we too must also be resolved to serve our country, to safeguard its promise, to accept responsibility for its destiny – "that these dead shall not have died in vain." This we do through assuming the responsibilities of good citizenship, by voting responsibly and paying our taxes; we do through putting the common good ahead of private self-interest and in "giving back" through volunteer service.

President Lincoln's words at Gettysburg still challenge us today:

"...(the) great task remaining before us...that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion; that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain; that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom; and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth ."

Love is the capacity to transcend oneself, to make a gift of oneself to another. We must make our families once again the schools where such love is taught and experienced and the gift of self is made possible, where children learn such love from parents – from mothers and fathers who are committed to each other in that stable and permanent relationship called marriage. This love aids us in a tangible way to understand the immense love of God the Father, and how He desires that His children live authentic freedom in their pursuit of happiness, fulfillment, and holiness.

Freedom is not the ability to do as we please but to do as we ought. It means that we can and do assume responsibility for our actions, to do good and not to do evil. To have the freedom to, above all, *choose the good* in all situations. It is not just a *freedom from*, but also a *freedom for – for the good, for love, for make a gift of oneself.* As Americans, we honor the sacrifice of those who died in the service of our nation and whose sacrifice has won for us the blessings of liberty. We thank, in a special way, those from our families and community who have given their lives for our freedom.

As Jesus tells us, blessed are the peacemakers for they shall be called the children of God. May the souls of all the faithful departed, especially those fallen in the service of this great nation, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

St. Stephens Catholic Church: Did You Know?

Did You Know It All Started at St. Catherine's Catholic Church in Sharon, WI?




St. Catherine's in Sharon is one of the oldest congregations in the State of Wisconsin. It served as the Mother Church to Clinton Catholics. St. Catherine's was built in 1911 and Father Stephen Peil became the pastor at St. Catherine's in 1940. Father Peil served a large area in his early years at Sharon. It stretched from the Lake Geneva-Fontana area to Clinton. When Father Peil came to Clinton in 1940, it was the practice to hold church services in Clinton once a month, during the months of October through April. In 1945, church was held in Clinton once a month all year long. Permission for a chapel was granted in 1948, and since that time, one Mass has been said every Sunday. In 1946, the Madison Diocese was established with the Rock-Walworth county line as the southeast boundary, with the exception of St. Catherine's parish which was to remain in the Milwaukee Diocese. In 1940, Father Peil became

the pastor of St. Catherine's and also pastor of the Clinton mission until 1970, when the Clinton area was large enough for its own parish. Father Gerard Healy was assigned to the parish in July of 1970. Members selected a name and created a separate church which was to be known as St. Stephen's Catholic Church. The name was to honor Father Stephen Peil. A parish council was formed and a constitution written. St. Stephen's became part of the Madison Diocese.


Mick and Donna Mullooly
