St. Stephen's Catholic Church: Did You Know (Original Church) - Continued

ST. STEPHEN'S CATHOLIC CHURCH

The original cross that hung behind the altar was the resurrected Christ cross that now hangs on the rear wall of the church. Sometime in the 1980's it was determined by the diocese that the cross behind the altar had to be the crucified Christ cross. A new cross was purchased and installed, while the original was preserved by moving it to the present location.

The original sound system was very basic and for only the front portion of seating. It has been upgraded to accommodate the needs of our present church.

The tabernacle existed for approximately 45 years in the brick opening to the right of the altar. It was moved to the present location directly behind the altar when mandated by the diocese.



Before the addition of the drive thru canopy and gathering space, the front entrance contained no stained-glass windows, and the inside area was half the size. The area above the brick on the exterior of the church was originally vertical steel siding that was a dark olive green when originally installed and faded to a dull army green. This was then replaced with the existing surface that was originally a sandstone color. This

just recently was repaired and became a shade of red.

The original parking lot was approximately a quarter the size of the existing lot. It extended to only about 40 feet past the north edge of the building. It was added on to when attendance increased and eventually became the existing size when the parish center was built.

When the original church was built, we did not have a rectory. Father Healy and Father Pat commuted from Beloit from 1973-1977. In 1977 our new rectory was blessed and dedicated.

As mentioned previously, the growth of the parish spurred the need of the rear portion of the church for permanent seating and in 1987 our present Parish Center was constructed.





Did You Know that the Original Church was much different than it is today?



The original church was divided in half by a large accordion door that recessed into pockets at either side when opened. The front portion was the main church with blue carpet on the altar and down the aisles only. All the remaining area was tile. The back half was all tile and was originally intended to serve as our parish hall. This area was used for Faith Formation, church meals, anniversary parties, wedding receptions, card parties, St. Patrick's Day Dances, and many other events.

There was a kitchen located where the church office is now, which was used also as a bride's room. There was a large serving window located just to the right of the existing door. As our parish gradually grew, Mass attendance at both the 8:00 and 9:30 Masses grew and eventually reached capacity. This would result in opening the doors to allow additional seating on folding chairs in the hall. This eventually led to consideration for building our current parish center building.



The original confessional was a curtain covered opening in the wall to the right of the main double door entrance into the church. After the hall portion became additional church seating, the confessional was moved to its current location.



The original baptismal font was located on the left side of the altar. It also was moved to the current location in the rear of church when permanent seating was established. Along with the simulated sloped roof and stone on the wall, a raised platform was installed with a stone font that had flowing water to it. This was eventually abandoned in favor of the existing baptismal font.

The original lighting came from cans mounted on the face of the roof beams. Father Pat was instrumental in the fabrication and

installation of the current stained glass chandelier lights. These originally contained spotlights that produced ineffective lighting and a lot of heat when you stood underneath. These have since been raised slightly and are now LED lit. All the original church windows contained clear glass. Again, Father Pat was instrumental in getting donors and the stained glass installed as we know it today.
