How do I fit the practice of my faith into the demands of everyday life? Putting our faith into action is the challenge of every believer. We are pulled between making time for prayer and good works on the one hand and raising a family and holding down a job on the other. It is difficult to pray the rosary or study the Bible when supper needs to be prepared, the kids need a ride to soccer practice or when we have to work overtime on a project. It is difficult to keep our minds focused on the kingdom of God when so many other demands are made on our time and energy. Nonetheless, Jesus calls us to love him no matter what the circumstances of our life may be.

This Sunday's readings give us some important clues on how to balance the practice of our faith with the demands of life in the 21st century. Love is the calling of every Christian. It makes everything we do pleasing to God. By adding a little love, we can take whatever we're doing and make it an opportunity to serve Jesus. When we offer our thoughts, words, and actions up to God in love, then the demands of job and family no longer get in the way of our life of faith, but actually help us to grow closer to God and others. They become opportunities for prayer as we draw on the power of his Spirit to enable us to love as he does.

We must be always ready to serve the needy around us. In today's gospel, two of the people who approach Jesus have excuses for not following him. But Jesus did not have time to wait around for them. It was "now or never." How many times have we used the demands of family life or of our job as an excuse not to practice charity? Mother Teresa said, "Stay where you are. Find your own Calcutta. Find the sick, the suffering, and the lonely, right where you are — in your own 5:30pm - In Thanksgiving for 5 Years of homes and in your own families, in homes and in your workplaces and in your schools. You can find Calcutta all over the world, if you have eyes to see. Everywhere, wherever you go, you find people who are unwanted, unloved, uncared for, just rejected by society - completely forgotten, completely left alone." She made a big change in a lot of people's hearts. She changed the world by loving - and loving hard. If we are to become holy in the 21st century we must not let our busy schedules be an excuse for not doing good. You were born here, and you are at this very place for a purpose.

> We do not have to give up on the hope of becoming saints because we have jobs and families. By offering our work up to God in love, by not valuing the accumulation of wealth too highly and by not allowing our busy lives to be an excuse to overlook the needs of others, we can discover a sure path to holiness in our everyday lives. Don't be afraid to do the ordinary, because to someone else it may be extraordinary. As "the saint of the gutters" said, "Do ordinary things with extraordinary love."

> I would like to thank Fr. Luis for coming to give a Parish Mission talk this weekend and sharing with us the great missionary work his Order is doing around the world to bring the Gospel to all peoples. May his witness inspire in us the call to be missionaries in our own families and community - that we would "Find our own Calcutta" right here in Clinton. Thank you for your hospitality and generosity to Fr. Luis and the Institute of the Incarnate Word this weekend!


