

FROM THE PASTOR:

Our Need for Super Heroes that Identify With Us

Since 1939, Stan Lee created or co-created some of the world's most popular superheroes. His super-human imagination gave birth to Black Panther, Spider-Man, the X-Men, Thor, Iron Man, the Fantastic Four, and the Incredible Hulk, just to name a few.

Of course, the world has no shortage of storytellers, but Lee took things to a new level. So, what set his stories apart from the rest? Lee was able to tap into deeply rooted human instincts. He once explained in an interview:

"The whole formula ... was to say: Let's assume that somebody really could walk on walls like *Spider-Man*, or turn green and become a monster like *The Hulk*. That's a given; we'll accept that. But, accepting that, what would that person be like in the real world if he really existed? Wouldn't he still have to worry about making a living? Or having acne and dandruff? Or his girlfriend jilting him? What are the real problems people would have? I think that's what made the books popular."

We all know we need a superhero to rescue us from our enemies and from calamities. But we simultaneously want this hero to be someone with whom we can identify. There are two instincts woven into our fallen nature: the knowledge that we need someone to save us and the deep desire for another to understand our struggles.

What does that sound like? Well, it sounds a lot like what we celebrate with the Incarnation—God taking the form of a human being.

Now, like Alfred Hitchcock, Lee was also well-known for his cameo appearances inside the stories he had written. Each film since X-Men in 2000 has featured a brief "incarnation" of the author.

Stan Lee wasn't the first to write himself into his storyline. Jesus did not simply rescue us from afar. He wrote himself into our story! He became a man and subjected himself to all the tyrannies of a fallen world. He's a man we can truly identify with!

Last week I went home to see my dad and we watched a couple episodes of the critically acclaimed *Chosen* series. Have you watched any of it? Parishioners know that I have mentioned this on numerous occasions. For our out of towners who have not heard of it, I highly recommend you download the free app and start watching the first two seasons, which consist of eight episodes. It's a profound spiritual experience—more so than any other account of the life of Jesus that I have seen. And it's taken the Christian world by storm. When you go on the app it shows how many people have viewed it. It's up to over 300 million worldwide!

Anyways, enough of the commercial for *Chosen*. In the one I was watching with my dad, the third episode of season two, the apostles are managing a long line of people who come to have Jesus heal them or perhaps just have a one on one encounter with Him. The apostles don't really see Jesus all day. They just see His effects and the people coming out of the tent where Jesus met them. Then, as they are sitting by the campfire they see Jesus coming back late at night. He collapses into his tent and you can see how exhausted He was. They were so focused on all the miracles He was doing, they had forgotten that He was still human. An 18 hour day of receiving a steady stream of people would exhaust anyone—including the Savior of the world! It was a powerful message to the apostles about Jesus' humanity and a reminder to us of how magnificent this celebration is. The Savior of the world takes on our flesh with all its limitations! We should never tire of such a spectacular gift we have been given. It's the greatest gift any one of us could ever receive.

Donating IRA assets to charity

Turn your Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) into charitable donations

IRS rules mandate that retired individuals after they reach age 72 (70 ½ if you turned 70 ½ before January 1, 2020) to take RMDs from their IRA each year, regardless of whether the income is needed. By making a charitable contribution from your IRA, you can satisfy your RMD amount without reporting additional income. This provision may be especially attractive for retirees who do not need all the income from their IRA to meet current living expenses. By donating the money to charity, you can enjoy the satisfaction of knowing that you are contributing to a worthy cause while effectively lowering your tax bill.



How it works

The provision allows retirees after they reach age 72 (70 ½ if you turned 70 ½ before January 1, 2020) to donate up to \$100,000 tax free from their IRA each year. Generally, when you take a distribution from your IRA, it is treated as taxable income. Under this provision, made permanent in the 2015 federal spending and tax package, those assets are excluded from income if the distribution is made directly to charity. The distribution is not included in your income so you avoid the potential negative consequences that regular IRA withdrawals in retirement can create, including taxes on Social Security benefits. Distributions excluded from income are also equivalent to a 100% deduction. Normally, charitable contribution deductions are limited to a lower percentage (or are eliminated altogether) for taxpayers who do not itemize and take the standard deduction.

Guidelines for donating IRA distributions to a charity

Eligibility	IRA account owner must be at least age 72 or 70 ½ if you turned 70 ½ before January 1, 2020 at time of IRA distribution in order to take advantage of this provision. Rule applies only to Traditional, Rollover, and Roth IRAs; SEPs and SIMPLE IRAs are generally excluded. Distributions of non-deductible IRA contributions also do not qualify.
Annual Limit	Maximum amount of a taxpayer's qualified charitable distribution must not exceed \$100,000 per tax year and may include required minimum distributions (RMDs).
Qualifications	Distribution must be made directly to a qualifying charity; private foundations and donor-advised funds are not eligible. Consult a tax professional for additional information.
Direct Contribution	The IRA Trustee or custodian must make the distribution directly to the charity. Distributions made payable to the IRA owner and transferred to the charity will not qualify.
