



John the Baptist has much been focused upon in the past several weeks in our readings at Mass. As the precursor of Christ, we heard him announcing the coming Messiah all the way back on the Second Sunday of Advent, announcing a baptism of repentance. Today, his ministry culminates as he baptizes Jesus in the Jordan. I have often wondered why the sinless Jesus, the Son of God, felt he needed to be baptized by John. Perhaps as an acceptance of the mission and work of the Father. What is that mission? As we hear in Isaiah today, "I formed you, and set you as a covenant of the people, a light for the nations, to open the eyes of the blind, to bring out prisoners from confinement, and from the dungeon, those who live in darkness." (Isaiah 42: 6—7) As God's suffering servant, Jesus, through this symbolic baptism, takes

on the work of the Father, which is ultimately to be mediator of the new creation—to raise up the lowly—to forgive and deliver us from sin—to conquer evil, and in a final act of love and obedience, death.

Today is a good day to remind ourselves of our own baptism, and to renew the promises that our parents, godparents, or sponsors made for us when we became members of the church. Are we embracing the graces we received at baptism? Today is the perfect day to once again renew our baptismal commitment so that just as Jesus heard the voice of the Father, we too might revel in knowing that God says to us, "You are my beloved: with you I am well pleased." "We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ." — Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and


purpose we need to properly live life.


are. This is how we live our baptism.





SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Hilary of Poitiers

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 – c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism, which denies Christ's divinity. He was exiled but fought with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. ©LPi
