

As a child, whenever I was nervous or bored, I would bite my nails. In high school, I relinquished this habit for "playing" with the skin around them. I thought nothing of pulling hangnails or tearing at my cuticles. It wasn't uncommon for me to be wearing two or three Band-Aids to prevent my "picking" or to cover the results of my picking. What I did to my fingers effected how my whole body worked. Each time that I would take this habit too far, I learned how much I actually used my thumb, my index finger, or pinky. The pain of a pulled hangnail in the winter led to a cracked open wound because my hands were dry. I never knew how much I used my thumb until the ability to use my thumb was felt painfully.

This relates to the analogy that Paul is writing about in the second reading today. When the body is working well, it can easily be taken for granted. When the body is not working well, the pain can be felt all over, even if it is "just the thumb." As the Body of Christ, the Church needs all of its members to work well. If any one of its members isn't well, or present, the Church feels it. Every member has a role, even if it is "just the thumb." The thumb is very important as anyone who has ever injured it will testify. Every member of the Body is significant to the work of the whole.

As the Body of Christ, the Church is His presence on earth. Every single one of us is Christ in the world, as we carry the Eucharist within us. We are the vessel by which He does His work. Without every part fully engaged, His work is not being accomplished. There are plenty of cracked thumbs, injured pinky toes, and paper cuts living out there who aren't able to fully function and participate in this work without feeling the sting. Just as we do to our body, we must brace, bandage, and care for those members of the body and bring them along to keep doing the work. We certainly wouldn't cut them off. Cutting off a thumb simply because of a hangnail makes no sense! We must care for it. We must care for one another to make the Body whole.

Jesus came to make the Body whole. He remains to keep the Body whole. It is us who choose to care for the Body or not. My habit is a reminder to me to care for my body. Once I begin to "pick," I know I am under stress and need to take care of myself. The pain I inflict on myself is the reminder of my need to turn it over to Jesus. When I shift my focus away from me and back to Jesus, my wounds heal. His wounds cure my wounds. His wounds cure all our wounds.


SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Thomas Aquinas

One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order (1225 – 1274), he is the patron of teachers, students, and theologians.

Born in Italy, his mother wanted him to become a Benedictine, but nothing could shake him from his vocation to become a Dominican priest. He finished his studies with Albert the Great.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The Summa Theologiae, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.




