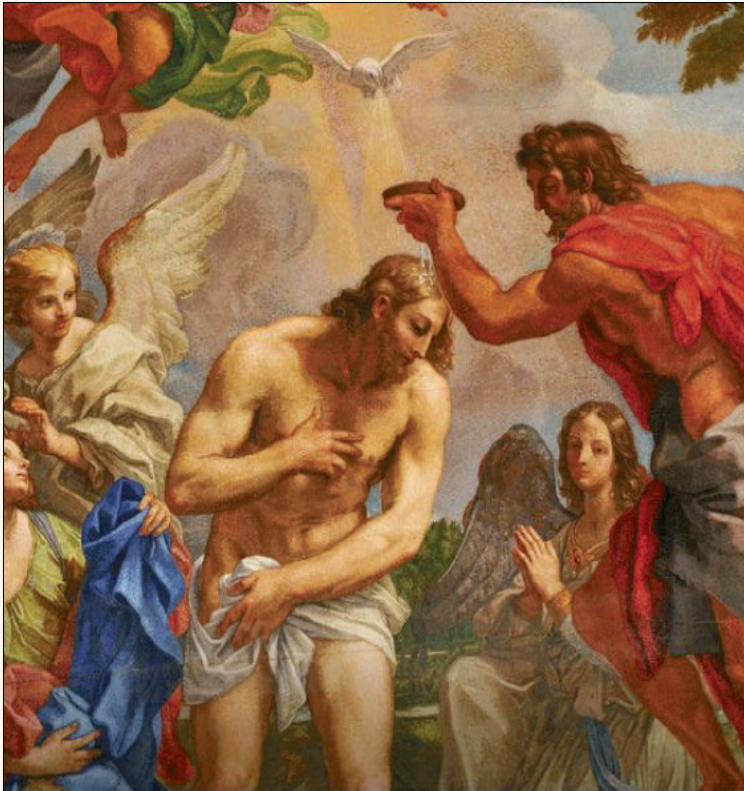

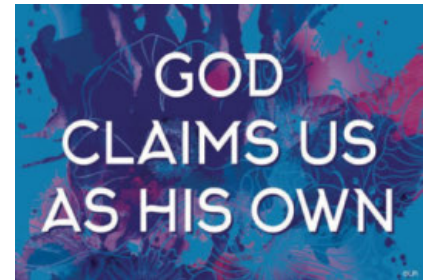
The Baptism of the Lord

"We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ."— Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The

answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.



It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest?

Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.

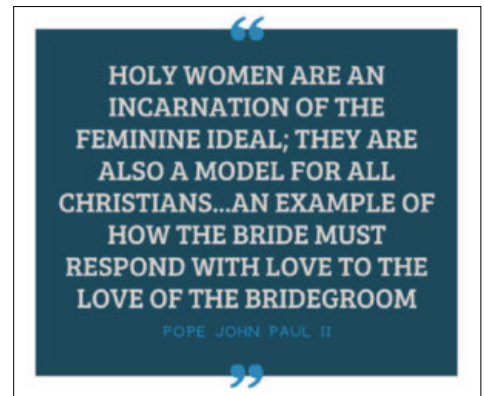
For all Women of Holy Angels

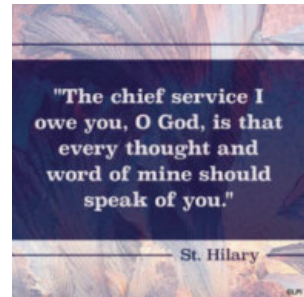

I hope you're open to more encouragement about spiritual goals for this New Year; so, here it is: This talking about resolutions (goals) reminds me of my years in the work place before retirement and being required to establish objectives for



the coming year, then being reviewed at the end of the year to determine the degree of accomplishment of those objectives. Call them whatever we want, objectives, goals, or resolutions, they can be a good tool for reminding us of things that need to be accomplished, be they for our workplace, our household or our spiritual life. However, the ones we make for our spiritual growth,

and hopefully accomplish, are most likely the only ones that could have an **eternal value** attached. Some suggestions for resolutions (objectives, goals) that have a chance of having an effect on our faith are as follows:

Daily prayer (talking to God), reading the Bible (God talking to us), attending Mass in addition to Sunday if possible, frequent confession, volunteering for a parish ministry, weekly Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, praying the Rosary and Divine Mercy Chaplet, reading a book about the life of a saint and/or other inspirational, faith-encouraging reading, listening, watching resources, using a Commentary reflection on the daily Scripture readings, praying the Stations of the Cross (in-Church, at the Grotto, at home), fasting from something we enjoy (even just one day a week?), and the list could go on; the important part is that we resolve to do something new, in addition to what we currently practice; anything that will help us grow in our faith and relationship with Jesus Christ.

Usually we are aware of things we need to make our homes more livable and comfortable, maintenance that's required to keep the house and car operating efficiently, things that need to be accomplished in order to meet the goals of our jobs and businesses but perhaps we give little thought to any additional needs for our faith. The beginning of a New Year is a good time to give some attention to what we might do to provide some maintenance" for our spiritual growth.

We can begin by asking the Holy Spirit to provide guidance and try to be paying attention; then, pray for the ability and desire to respond, mindful that our response can pay large dividends, in fact, it can have **eternal value**. May our efforts provide new faith discoveries in this New Year, 2022.

Let's be sure to keep one another in prayer.
