


Holy Angels Parish Mission Statement



LIFE IN ACTION HIGHLIGHT OF THE MONTH

December 2021

"Tess" came to us six months after giving birth to her second child. She had decided to parent her 6month-old the last time she was pregnant and was not happy about being pregnant so soon. She had already inquired about abortion and was told to wait until she was six weeks pregnant.



When the ultrasound revealed "Tess" was further along than she thought, she was surprised and just didn't know what to do because she was well over six weeks. While she had the support of the father, she still felt she could not parent and scheduled an abortion.

The day before her scheduled abortion her car was towed, and she had no way to get to that appointment. Over a period of six weeks, the medical and resource team met with "Tess" to provide her with medical information, emotional and spiritual support and whatever material assistance she needed to address her pregnancy.

After four ultrasounds, "Tess" has indicated she will parent. It will be a difficult journey, but we will walk with her every step of the way.


For all Women of Holy Angels



As we continue on our spiritual journey in our efforts to grow in our faith, may we consider the following:

A 1984 movie, *All of Me*, featuring Steve Martin as lawyer, Roger Cobb, and Lily Tomlin as Edwina Cutwater, an eccentric, but sour spinster on the verge of dying, provided what I refer to as "a **classic** statement."

In the movie, Edwina is determined that, when she dies, her soul will be mystically transported into the body of an attractive young woman and has made arrangements to have that happen. However, when her death occurs, the guru in charge of the transfer 'goofs' and her soul takes control of the entire right side of her lawyer, Roger Cobb. As this situation progresses, Edwina shares this statement with Roger: "There's nothing sadder than looking back at the end of your life and saying, 'I didn't do it right,' and believe me, 'I know'."

This statement got my attention more than anything else in the movie; it was what I call "a **classic** statement." For most, if not all of us, there are perhaps some things in our lives that, if we could, we would do differently; however, I believe the most important, the most crucial thing that we would hope **to not have regrets about** is our relationship with Jesus Christ. Unfortunately, it was too late for Edwina to make any changes by the time she made the discovery that led her to say, "I didn't do it right."

For those of us able to read this, it's not too late – yet. If we're aware of changes that need to be made in our lives, and that can often be our biggest challenge, there's still time; but only until we are called from this life, and, of course, we have no clue when that call may come, so best we get started on the changes – **soon**. Let's get started on "doing it right."

May we pray for a burning desire to know Jesus in a personal way, with an openness to allowing Him greater access into our lives by spending quiet time with Him. May we never be accused of saying, "I'm perfectly happy just the way I am."

When we are called from this life, our hope is we go to face Someone we know and love, not a stranger. May we respond as the servants at the wedding at Cana responded to the Blessed Mother's instruction to "Do whatever he tells you," and allow Jesus to fill us "to the brim."
