For a decade now, the Shepherd of the Hills faith community has joined multiple other churches and community groups serving a meal to those in need through a program called Loaves and Fishes. The meal site is located at the Church of Peace on Military Road in Fond du Lac. *Our parish serves four times a year and our next turn to help out is on Monday, February 7.*

Though the pandemic has caused this meal to be served in a "drivethrough pick up" format, the need is still there! The numbers continue to fluctuate, but we are preparing to serve 150 guests. We serve a meal of homemade beef stew, fresh fruit and bars/cookies for dessert.

SCRIP NEWS

ATTENTION calling all SOTH parishioners! How about your New Year's Resolution is to help out the parish by just ordering gift cards? *It doesn't cost you anything extra to use.* This is how easy it is. You order a gift card at face value, but the retailer sells them to us at a discount. That discount is retained in an account and is disbursed to the parish in July. You can start small by ordering gas and groceries - besides you use them on a weekly basis anyway.

Here is an example of how it works:

You purchase a *Festival Foods* gift card for \$100 (you pay full face value) the retailer sell them to us at a 3% discount which would mean that \$3.00 is retained in an account.

<u>Another example is Kwik Trip.</u> You purchase a \$100 gift card at face value. The retailers sell them to us at a 4% discount. That would mean that \$4.00 is retained in the account also. It may seem like \$3.00 or \$4.00 isn't much, but amounts add up quickly! Just think, if every parishioner used scrip, we would really be making a difference in helping our parish!

Again, you only pay face value for the cards - You are not paying anything extra

To get started, you can either place your order online (contact Nancy Loehr for more information) or you can complete a paper order form located outside the coffee house. All orders to be processed **MUST** be received before the start of 8:15 Mass on Sundays and available be picked up *immediately* after the 8:15 Mass. For more information how you can help our parish by using scrip (at not extra cost to you), contact Nancy Loehr at <u>sothscrip@gmail.com</u>

Starting January 9th, you will once again have the option of picking up your scrip at the parish office. If scrip is available for pick up immediately after 8:15 Mass on Sundays it will be directed to the parish office. Back orders will also be placed there. If you would still rather pick up scrip from the coordinators home, please contact Nancy at sothscrip@gmail.com.. Also please note, you will need to sign a form when you pick up your scrip at the parish office. This procedure is for liability purposes. Parish office hours for pick up will be 6:30 am to 3 pm Monday through Thursday Only. The parish office is closed on Fridays.
