Second Sunday in Ordinary Time - January 16

Isaiah 62:1-5. Psalm 96:1-2, 2-3, 7-8, 9-10. 1 Corinthians 12:4-11. John 2:1-11.

Believing Signs. At first glance, these readings lead us to bride and groom, gifts, and marriage. But there are important things underneath, important truths at the heart of these proclamations. God has not and will not abandon us (Isaiah). Charisms, that is, gifts of the Spirit, are given to everyone to use for the common good, not just one's own good (Corinthians). The miracle of water to wine is the first of many signs of the Messiah, the Christ (John). God's signs and good activity are everywhere.

- What evidence do I have that God is with us still?
- What gifts that I have, given by the Spirit, will I put to use for the good of another?
- Christ is active all the time. What little and big signs of this goodness can I be part of? What signs will I rejoice in?

Dear Friends,

What you may know: on January 22, 1973, the Supreme Court decided the Roe v. Wade case, that "women in the United States have a fundamental right to choose whether or not to have abortions without excessive government restriction."

Since the court's ruling, nearly 60 million children have been aborted in this country. To give some perspective, that's nearly 20%, one in five, of the latest US Census.

What you may not know: Jane Roe, the plaintiff in the case (whose real name was Norma McCorvey), would become a Christian in 1994. Four years later, she was received into the Catholic Church.

McCorvey later candidly admitted that her involvement in the case was the biggest mistake of her life. In her second book, *Won by Love*, she explains the moment she changed her mind:

"I was sitting in O.R.'s offices when I noticed a fetal development poster. The progression was so obvious... It hurt my heart, just looking at them. I ran outside and finally, it dawned on me. 'Norma', I said to myself, 'They're right'. I had worked with pregnant women for years. I had been through three pregnancies and deliveries myself. I should have known. Yet something in that poster made me lose my breath. I kept seeing the picture of that tiny, 10-week-old embryo, and I said to myself, that's a baby! It's as if blinders just fell off my eyes and I suddenly understood the truth—that's a baby!"

Until her death in 2017, McCorvey would help organize and lead the March for Life in Washington DC. This year, the March falls on Saturday, January 22nd.

May I make a suggestion? Will you mark your calendars and join me this Friday the 21st in a day of prayer and fasting for the hundreds of thousands of pro-lifers marching and for the overturning of this egregiously evil law?

Pray too for the conversion of hearts—ours and those who haven't seen what McCorvey saw.


