Third Sunday in Ordinary Time — January 23

We devote this day to the celebration, study, and spread of the Word of God.

Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10 * Psalm 19:8, 9, 10, 15 * 1 Corinthians 12:12-30 * Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21

Believing the Word of God. We are the Body of Christ (Corinthians) assembling as the graced community of believers (Nehemiah) each week to give thanks and praise, to share in Communion, and then sent to serve. We are part of the great Communion of Saints to whom is handed down the living Word of God – both the Scriptures and the Tradition as well as the very person of Christ who is the spoken Word of God (Luke). During the first Mass in a brand in the church building, the bishop shows the *Lectionary* to the assembly and says: "May the word of God resound always in this building, to open for you the mystery of Christ and to bring about your salvation in the Church."

Dear Friends.

While at my previous assignment, I made friends with the Christian church minister in town. A very fine man and pastor who knew the Scriptures, I admired him very much. One day I asked him what his church believed—did they believe the creed?

He said, "Our church denomination lives by the slogan: 'No creed but Christ.'" While having a nice ring to the slogan, it struck me as completely unhistorical and totally unworkable.

Just after Christianity was legalized in the fourth century, the Emperor Constantine called a meeting of the world's bishops in a city named Nicaea in order to address the issue that was tearing the Church apart: the divinity of Jesus Christ.

A sizable proportion, even at times a majority, of Christians at the time followed the teachings of an Egyptian priest named Arius who said that Jesus was not divine. He was, instead, the greatest of all creatures.

The ecumenical council of Nicaea condemned Arius and his teaching. Jesus Christ is true God and true man. And to combat the Arian heresy as well as others, they developed a brief statement of beliefs called the Creed. We still recite it every Sunday to remind us of Divine Truth and to maintain the unity of the Church.

This Lent, let's rediscover the great gift of the Creed.

Starting March 3rd, we will meet weekly on Thursdays at 6:30 pm for six weeks to discuss the intellectual and spiritual depths of the Creed.

March 3rd: I Believe

March 10th: God, the Father Almighty

March 17th: Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son

March 24th: He Suffered Death

March 31st: Holy Spirit, the Giver of Life

April 7th: One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic

This will coincide with RCIA in hopes you will come to meet and get to know our catechumen, Jordan White, a good-hearted young man full of enthusiasm for the Faith.


