

Father Russ, parish leadership and the building committee began their work in the Fall of 2016. Ground was broken on November 8, 2018, and the conclusion was completed in time for our pork chop dinner on August 11, 2019. Now, it is December 2021 and our project that carried a price tag of just over 1 million dollars is paid in full!

Many people contributed to the successful completion of our new hall, but it is God's blessings and you, the parishioners of St. Mary's, that made it happen with your time, talent and treasure.

Dear Parishioners,

When I was a boy in the 1960's, before the advent of selfies, there was a portrait studio names Olan Mills, that used to do in home pictures for families and individuals. They would bring a backdrop, lighting and camera and shoot a family photo in the living room. Later, the photographer would come back and show you the results and sell you a package of pictures.



Family pictures are such a treasure. They can be a little hokey but they bring such great memories. I remember the shirt I was wearing in that family portrait. I remember the bad haircut I had that was some combination of a 1960's short cut parted on the side and long hair growing over my ears and long bangs. Mom's face looked frozen and my sister had a painted on smile, she could never naturally smile then but now has a beautiful smile. My father had on his business suit and even though he was a thin guy it was probably the heaviest he ever was. We had just moved to Fort Worth, lived on Gary Lane and my older brother was living in Austin; our first family picture without him. We were not exactly the Holy Family but that picture brings back so many memories every time I see it.

The images we have of the Holy Family remind me of one of those Olan Mills portraits. In them I see a man, a woman and a child... a family, that like my own, has been brought into existence by the hand of God. Every picture tells a story and the picture of the Holy Family has a story to tell all of its own. It tells the story of faith, struggle, journey, miracle, grace, courage, salvation, love, hope, awe, divine protection, obedience, risk, humility... I'm sure I could go on. Perhaps you can add to this list also!

I know the story of that 1971 family portrait of my family isn't near as expansive as that of the Holy Family, but it is special, unique and mine. The beauty of God is that the story of the Holy Family is ours also. All of their attributes are available to us. It is God's way. Merry Christmas, Fr. Russ



The Acts of the Apostles tells the story of St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr. A man filled with grace and power, he worked great wonders among the people. Some Jews debated with St. Stephen but could Jews debated with st. Stephen but could not match his wisdom and spirit. Eventually, a charge of blasphemy was brought up against him, and the local population demanded that he be tried and sentenced. He was seized and carried before the

Despite the danger he faced, in front of the Sanhedrin and his accusers, St. Stephen gave a long speech about the history of Israel and the blessings that God had given harder and the bessings that doe had given upon His chosen people. He talked about how Israel had become disobedient despite God's abundant mercy. This terraged his accusers, and eventually the crowd dragged him out of the city and stoned him to death.

Even in his final moments St. Stephen displayed great forgiveness and even asked God not to hold the sins of his attackers against them. Hundreds of years after his death, he is still a role model for us to follow.

Our dinner and festival was a huge success this year! We grilled an astonishing 4000 Pork Chops and served the best dinner around!






