#### The Necessity of You!

There is something amazing in our second reading from the First letter of St. Paul to the Church in Corinth, "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit."

What can we conclude from this passage in regards to our life in Christ? Clearly, each of us has a gift or gifts from God through the working of the Holy Spirit in our lives for the Church and the whole world. Yes you! You are gifted with something that others are not and you have a mission that affects you and the people God has given to you to attend to, to serve, to love, and to care for in all our days. Paul then goes on to list those gifts as you can read for yourself or recall from Mass.

While the last line noted above from this reading can sound a bit soft, it isn't! It is a clear note from Paul that the gifts you have been given will benefit the Church in some way or another. I caution all who read these words to not take these words lightly. Your faithful execution of the gifts that you have been given by God will likely change the path someone is on for the better. Do not think of these gifts as something extremely big or earth-shattering, but approach them as The Little Flower St. Therese of Lisieux would: as attending to the smallest details of the day with great love and devotion for God and the mission of Jesus Christ for the salvation of all souls. It can be as simple as a letter of encouragement for someone who is sad or heartbroken or cooking a meal for a family with a child in the hospital or who just had a new baby. How about some diapers for our Bundle the Bottoms diaper and wipe drive. The list of things your gifts can bring to the world are as limited as your imagination. Think about it! Your gifts that God has given you are necessary! You are necessary! The world needs you! God gave you something special to share with others.

Jesus Christ Himself is a clear sign of this reality. He held nothing back for himself. He gave everything he has and is for you! What will you do with your gifts today?


