

From our Pastor

The Trajectory of Lent

Sometimes people ask questions about the Old Testament, wondering what they are supposed to get out of these stories and how to make sense of it all. It is 1,000 pages after all! Typically we preach more from the Gospel, which is as it should be since our Lord Jesus

is the fullness of God's Revelation. But the Old Testament is essential to know how Israel brought forth Jesus and why they needed Him.

The Old Testament readings of Lent have a trajectory that lay out the main arc of the story.

In the first week we have Noah. We learn that the sin of Adam and Eve has grown and contaminated the whole world. God does not give up on humanity, but seeks to save what is still good in His Creation.

The second week we see new life and new promise in the covenant with Abraham, who is the first patriarch. Isaac is the son of the promise, through whom God will bring forth an uncountable people from Abraham and Sarah. But Abraham also is tested in a terrible way to sacrifice his son. However it will not be his son that is sacrificed for the Covenant, but rather God's.

The third week we see that Moses, after he leads the people out of Egypt, is given God's Law, so that they would know God's way. The Law will be both their tutor and their judge. They will fail to live up to it time and again. They will worship other gods, they will murder, and they will steal from the weak.

The fourth week the people fall into worshipping other gods and God allows the Temple to be destroyed by the Babylonians. Miraculously, when the Persians defeat the Babylonians, they send to Jews back home to rebuild the Temple. While God chastises his unfaithful people, He continues to consider them His special people.

The fifth week God promises to make a new Covenant with His people. They broke the Covenant made through Moses, but the new Covenant will be written in their hearts. This is what Jesus references at the Last Supper when He says "This is the New Covenant in my blood",

Genuflecting & Kneeling

Genuflection is an act of devotion that literally means "to bend the knee." For many Catholics, it's an almost automatic gesture that we perform before entering our pew or row of seats at Mass. But, like many of the symbols and gestures of our faith tradition, genuflecting can also be an invitation for deeper reflection.

The practice of "bending the knee" is an ancient way of recognizing the presence of someone greater than we are. It has been said that the practice dates back to the time of Alexander the Great, but it became a common part of etiquette in the royal courts of the Middle Ages. From throne rooms and palaces, it was a small step to genuflecting, becoming part of the devotional lives of Christians who used this secular gesture as a way of recognizing the presence of the One who is King of Kings, especially in the Eucharist. In our tradition, although many have been taught or prefer to genuflect by placing their right knee on the ground, there is no prescribed way to genuflect. This is especially important to keep in mind if physical limitations or age make certain movements difficult for us.

Today, Catholics are asked to genuflect in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament (whether in the tabernacle or exposed on the altar during eucharistic adoration). So, while it has become second nature to genuflect before entering your seat in church, we should pay attention to where the Blessed Sacrament is kept in each church or chapel we visit, and genuflect in the direction of the tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament is kept. In churches or chapels in which the tabernacle is in a separate space, we are invited to simply bow toward the altar.



PRAYER FASTING ALMSGIVING The Three Pillars of Lent

PRAYER The more time given to prayer during Lent will draw us closer to the Lord. Without prayer, fasting and almsgiving are merely actions we do out of tradition without much meaning. Prayer is our conversation with God it is through prayer that we find the strength to fast It is through prayer that we develop a closer more intimate relationship with God.

FASTING We fast as a form of prayer so that we can progress to greater love. The practice of fasting is a way to grow in humility and acknowledge one sins, and it is and it can be a part of intercessory prayer for the good of another or a part of worship. Jesus, of course, sanctified the practice by his forty day fast in the wilderness in preparation for his public ministry.

ALMSGIVING Almsgiving, the third traditional pillar of Lent is a sign of our care for those in need and an expression of our gratitude for all that God has given to us. Works of charity and the promotion of justice are integral elements of the Christian way of life we began when we were baptized. The Lord expects us to share more than we can give by writing a check. While monetary giving is praiseworthy, it is love-the personal act of self-giving-that Jesus asks of us.



Perfect Contrition-Where the individual faithful find
themselves in the painful impossibility of receiving
Sacramental absolution, it should be remembered that
perfect contrition, coming from the love of God, be-
loved above all things, expressed by a sincere request
for forgiveness (that which the penitent is at present able to express) and
accompanied by votum confessionis, that is, by the firm resolution to
have recourse, as soon as possible, to sacramental confession, obtains
forgiveness of sins, even mortal ones (cf. CCC, no. 1452)

Perfect contrition means a sorrow for sin out of love for God.
It does not mean being “perfectly sorry.” Perfect contrition is sorrow
for sin out of love for God and His goodness, whereas imperfect
contrition (while still a gift of God) is sorrow for sin due to a fear of
hell, judgment and punishment.

33-DAY CONSECRATION TO ST. JOSEPH

In this Year of St. Joseph, join the 33-day consecration to meditate on each of St. Joseph's titles and the graces he can bring to your life.

What does it mean to consecrate yourself to St. Joseph? You acknowledge St. Joseph as your spiritual father, and you want to be like him. To show it, you entrust yourself entirely into his paternal care so that he can help you acquire his virtues and become holy. Total consecration to St. Joseph means you make a formal act of filial (duty of a child to its parents) entrustment to your spiritual father so that he can take care of your spiritual well-being and lead you to God.

As an individual, how do I consecrate myself to St. Joseph?

1 Consecration to St. Joseph emulates the tried-and-true preparation method employed by St. Louis de Montfort in his Marian consecration, highlighting many of St. Joseph's titles, privileges, and heroic virtues. The program of preparation and consecration takes 33 days. **It can be undertaken on your own or in a group.**

2 To make a 33-day consecration, our parish groups are using the book: *Consecration to St. Joseph: The Wonders of Our Spiritual Father* by Fr. Donald Calloway, MIC. **The book is not necessary.** If you'd like to do the consecration without the book, see Step #4.

3 Choose a consecration date—which is day 33 of your consecration. Our parish date is March 19. Feast of St. Joseph (the parish consecration started February 15). **Good news—its not too late to start—**simply recite prayers more than once a day until you catch up so you finish on March 19 and can celebrate with the parish.

4 Spend about 20-30 minutes a day on a short exposition on one of the invocations in the powerful Litany of St. Joseph, followed by a reading on St. Joseph, concluding with the recitation of the Litany of St. Joseph. If you miss a day, just make it up and continue your preparation.

5 Day 33—Finish your consecration at home with the final prayer *Prayer of Consecration to St. Joseph* (see below) or join us: March 19 Feast of St. Joseph for Mass at 6:00PM at which time we will say the Prayers of Consecration.




