




Next will be an exciting short program for all ages. This will include short talks, music, videos, a prayer of the month, an idea of how to live the faith at home, and/or interactive games.

Then the children will go off to their classrooms while the adults have a themed session for learning, prayer, and discussion amongst themselves.







WHAT IS A RELIC?

The word “relic” comes from the Latin reliquiae, meaning “remains”.

A reliquary is a container for relics.

Relics are classified in 3 categories:

- First Class relics are parts of the bodies of saints or instrument of the Passion (such as fragments of the Cross).
- Second Class relics are objects which have been in close contact with the saints, such as articles of clothing or personal items. In the case of a martyr, the instruments of martyrdom are also considered in this category.
- Third Class relics are objects such as rosaries or cloths which have been touched to the body of the saint or to either a first- or second-class relic.

Relics honored in the Catholic Church are the bodies of saints, or objects connected with them or with Our Lord. Relics deserve to be venerated.

The bodies of the Saints were temples of the Holy Spirit and instruments through which God worked.



Because of their very nature, major relics are scarce and difficult to obtain. It is a common custom, however, for the postulators of causes for beatification and for religious orders to distribute second- and third-class relics, often on holy cards with prayers for the cause.

RELICS OF THE TRUE CROSS

Most prized of all relics are the relics of Christ’s passion, particularly the cross on which he died. Some scoff at the relics of the Cross and say that there are too many to be genuine. However, if all known pieces were put together, they would make a block smaller than half a cubic foot. Today, the twelve most famous portions of the true Cross range from 6.33 cubic inches to 33 cubic inches. The largest of these are found in Jerusalem, Brussels, Ghent and Rome. The particles venerated are very small.

The true cross was found by St. Helena, mother of Emperor Constantine the Great, in the year 326. Her workmen, digging on Mount Calvary in search of the true Cross of Christ, found three crosses. Two of the crosses were applied without result to a very sick woman. As soon as the third cross touched her, she was instantaneously cured. The adoration of the Cross on Good Friday is part of Holy Week devotions. The Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross is September 14.

ST. MARIA GORETTI
JULY 6

At St. Joseph, eight of the ten Shrines house an Italian wood-carved statue designed for the devotion and inspiration of the faithful. A stained-glass window in the background bears the name of the saint. At each saint’s shrine is a first-class relic.

St. Maria Goretti’s reliquary is currently being refurbished. She is the patron of youth, young women, purity and victims of rape. She was born in 1890 and died in 1902. St. Maria Goretti is considered a martyr because she fought against attempts of sexual assault. She was canonized in 1950 by Pope Pius XII for her purity and as a model for youth.

Although the Church today neither encourages or discourages the cult of relics, their use as sacramentals is still popular. While the honor and veneration of relics is commendable, provided superstitious practices do not accompany it, Our Lord himself, in an apparition to Saint Gertrude the Great, mentioned a non-materialistic relic that all Christians would do well to consider.

Our Lord said to her, “If you desire to have some relics which will draw my heart into yours, read My Passion and meditate attentively on every word contained therein and it will be to you a true relic which will merit more graces for you, than any other - thence you may know and be assured that the words which I uttered when on earth are the most precious relics which you can possess.”
