

**From our Pastor**



As part of my seminary studies, I wrote a substantial paper on lay people and the Universal Call to Holiness. This is an essential teaching of the church that should guide the working of parishes and the way in which we support the lay people in their mission.

There are two common misconceptions on the role of the laity. One is that the priests and nuns do the “real” work of the Church while the laity are to pray, pay and obey. This false attitude that the clergy and religious constitute the active Church and the laity the secondary or passive Church, “as if nothing can be done in the Church unless the priest does it...and as if the Church is not present there in any place if there is no cassock about.” (Yves Congar, Lay People in the Church)

The second misconception is that lay people should do the same things as the religious and that church ministries are their main path to holiness. This leads to drawing all the energy and talent of the most devout lay people into church work rather than being a light to the world. It also frustrates the lay leaders because they aren’t allowed to do all the ministries that priests do.

Cardinal Yves Congar wrote of a third option that was adopted by the Church at Vatican II, but isn’t always followed. Congar noted that, in the Scriptures, Jesus called some out of their world (like Matthew), while others were sent back to their daily lives (like Zaccheus). The laity have a distinct role alongside the religious, rather than following them as closely as possible. Their mission is in the world. He emphasizes the will of God and God's call for the individual. The ultimate end for serving in the Church and serving in the world is salvation, but the means of achieving it are different.

Baptism is the key Sacrament that unites all believers and gives us a calling to serve God as priests (worshipping), prophets (sharing the Gospel), and kings (giving order to what is entrusted to you). The role of the laity is to be leaven; to sanctify the world from the inside, instead of from a distinctly sacred position, as the clergy do. What constitutes the work of the laity is the faithful accomplishment of their daily tasks, the sanctification of family and social life and the transformation of the world to be a place of justice, love and peace. This work in the world can be sanctified by its being offered at the altar to the Father alongside the Body of Christ. This is why the priest prays that the Lord will accept “my sacrifice and yours”. The daily works and hardships of the laity are acceptable sacrifices offered to God.

While some lay people are additionally called to share in the ministries within the church, the apostolate proper to the laity is bringing the light of Christ out into the world and seeking to make “Thy Kingdom come. On Earth, as it is in Heaven”.







# Saint Mary Magdalene

## July 22

Mary Magdalene has been the subject of speculation and scholarship over the last 2,000 years. Mary Magdalene makes her first named appearance in Luke 8:2; she is one of several women following Jesus. Luke specifically mentions that Mary had previously been delivered from demonic possession yet we don't know for certain what her life looked like before she met Jesus. Mary Magdalene has been mistakenly associated with other stories in the Gospel, such as the woman caught in adultery or the woman who bathes Jesus' feet with her tears.

Mary Magdalene shows up again by name at the end of the Gospels, when she stands with the Blessed Virgin Mary at the foot of the Cross. Mary is also present in the garden of the resurrection. She is one of the woman who goes to bring spices to Jesus' tomb, where they find the stone rolled away. Mary stays in the garden weeping, believing his body has been stolen. Jesus approaches her and calls her by name, and she becomes the first witness to the resurrection. While many of the details of Mary Magdalene's life have been lost to time, she is an example of powerful conversion, deep faith, loyalty and intimate love for Christ.






*Afterward he journeyed from one town and village to another, preaching and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom of God. Accompanying him were the Twelve and some women who had been cured of evil spirits and infirmities, Mary, called Magdalene, from whom seven demons had gone out, Joanna, the wife of Herod's steward Chuza, Susanna, and many others who provided for them out of their resources.*

The Basilica and National Shrine  
of Mary Help of Christians

Parishioners Tim and Linda Higgs went to Mass in the Chapel of St. Thérèse at the Basilica and National Shrine of Mary Help of Christians at Holy Hill, Hubertus WI.

The Chapel of St. Thérèse is located one level below the Main Church and was dedicated on July 15, 1928. Masses were celebrated here during the two years that the Main Church was being built. The Chapel is now used for liturgies for special groups, and during the winter when the number of visitors to the Shrine is smaller.

Under the care of the Discalced Carmelite Friars of Holy Hill since 1906, the shrine is open to the public and draws hundreds of thousands of pilgrims and sightseers annually.
