



From our Pastor



On Friday we celebrated the feast of the great St. Bernard of Clairvaux. He was an abbot who wrote beautifully on loving God.

St. Bernard wrote in an original way about human freedom and we can learn a lot from him even 1,000 years later. Since we Americans value freedom so highly, it would be good for us to think more deeply about what freedom is and what it is for.

St. Bernard said that our confusion about freedom comes from there being really three different freedoms: free choice (ability to choose), free pleasure (power to accomplish choice), and free counsel (wisdom to know what to choose).

St. Bernard says that free choice is a gift of God that allows us to will and choose. This is often what we think of as freedom, but he says unless we know what is worth choosing and have the ability to obtain what we want, our freedom is actually quite constrained.

To have free pleasure would be the full power to obtain and enjoy what we want. This freedom is limited and frustrated by the world. We have all sorts of wants that we lack the ability to fulfill. But, sometimes when we do fulfill our desires, we realize it wasn't a great as we hoped. Once a need is satisfied, the pleasure ends, which can lead to an endless pursuit of fleeting pleasure. While this is frustrating, it indicates a need for something beyond being free to choose things and the power to get them; we need wisdom.

Free counsel is that true wisdom which allows us to know what is good to choose. St. Bernard says that free counsel only comes to those who have crucified their passions and desires, so that they can see rightly. Jesus says that many who should see, do not. He said it is the pure of heart that shall see God.

The reason for giving people wide allowance to decide for themselves isn't because all decisions are equally good, but that people need to be free to discover what is good through free choices.

Most people sin because they seek a false good and love their pursuit of what they desire more than they love obedience to God. It isn't that they hate God, but that they think doing things God's way would get in their way. This is a lack of wisdom. Bernard concludes by saying that those in hell have not lost free will, but they have lost all wisdom. Rather than desiring paradise with God, they see God as getting in their way and capriciously not giving them the power to get what they want. So they end in cursing God rather than in celebrating the true good that God has made them for. This is a sad state, but respects the free will that God has given to us.

To know the good, to choose the good, and to have the power to obtain it will only be fully realized in heaven. However, by growing in wisdom we can give better order to our lives and discover how to direct our freedom well.

•Our intention this week is for peace.

Many people give their allegiance to something until it asks them to do something challenging or radical. Then, they find themselves rethinking whether they want to be associated with it.

The same holds for God. Either we serve God, or we don't. There can be no lukewarm stance with regard to faith. If we are in, then faith in Jesus Christ asks us to do some difficult things: work in service of God's kingdom, love our enemies, offer no resistance to injury, and trust that the Eucharist is in fact Jesus' very Body and Blood. For some, buying into these things may prove too difficult and a return to a life without them is preferred. But truth is truth and it can only be found in God. If we find it hard to accept it from the mouth of Christ, where else can we go to find it? The task before us is to commit to the truth even when it may be easier to pursue something else. Truth is always worth obtaining even when it is difficult. Jesus offers us the truth of life, a life that is found in his own flesh and blood and a life of discipleship.

Sacramentals

THE ALTAR, TABERNACLE AND CREDENCE TABLE

Third in a Series



THE ALTAR

The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is offered on a consecrated altar. Placing the gift on the altar signifies its being handed over to God. In the Christian religion the altar symbolizes Christ, for He was the altar as well as the priest and the victim of the sacrifice.

In the early centuries when the threat of persecution was always present, there were few churches and Christians met to worship in private homes where a table was used for an altar. On just such a table Christ instituted the Holy Mass for the church on Holy Thursday.

Beginning about the fourth century, Mass was celebrated over or under tombs of the martyrs. From this arose the custom of having a saint's relics under or in every altar.

By the sixth century, Holy Mass was celebrated in churches and the Holy Sacrifice was offered on altars of stone. In ancient days, the altar was built so that the priest offering Mass faced the people. Later altars were built in the apse of the church so that the people were behind the priest. In an instruction prepared by Pope Saint Paul VI for the implementation of the Decree of the Constitution of Sacred Liturgy of Vatican Council II, he declared: "It is proper that the main altar be constructed separately from the wall so that one may go around it with ease and so that celebration may take place facing the people."

Today the altar is consecrated by a bishop with special ceremonies. For the celebration of Mass, a crucifix is placed near the altar and candles are lit. Interestingly, the Byzantine altar is square and has a wooden top.



In the High Altar at St. Joseph Church are the relics of St. Beata and St. Amadeo. Bishop Loras Thomas Lane consecrated the altar on April 11, 1957.

THE TABERNACLE

The tabernacle is a kind of safe, usually made of metal with a locking door, in which the Blessed Sacrament is reserved. In the Old Testament, the tent which sheltered the Ark of the Covenant was called the tabernacle. It was a wooden frame covered with cloth and ram skins and was portable. The tabernacle for the Holy Eucharist developed over the centuries and by the sixteenth century its present form was in common use. Of special interest to us at Saint Joseph, is that the original tabernacle from our first church is in our sacristy. This tabernacle dates to September 28, 1902.



THE CREDENCE TABLE

These are small tables or shelves at the side of the sanctuary where the chalice, ciborium, cruets, basin, finger towel, purificators and communion chalices are placed in preparation for the celebration of Mass.
