### Reflection for Pentecost Sunday - By Deacon Steve Pulkrabek

Who provides hope in your life? Are you so filled with your own pride that you believe that you are able to accomplish on your own all that you have been called to do? The Holy Spirit dwells within us. Our relationship with Jesus depends on our belief and trust in Him. This is not a particularly thoughtful statement as we usually are friends with those we trust and have confidence in.

In a relationship there is a sharing of understanding and respect. What we are looking at here is the fullness of what God longs to share with us, the gift of love between the Father and Son. In Corinthians we are told; "No one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit." It is through the Holy Spirit that we are animated. "For in Him we live and move and have our being." (Acts17:28)

He strengthens us in our fight against temptations and in our mission of bearing witness to Christ. The Holy Spirit makes us holy through the Sacraments. Through Baptism He makes us children of God and heirs of Heaven. Through Confirmation, He makes us temples of God, warriors, and defenders of the Faith. Through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, He enables us to be reconciled with God by pardoning our sins. Through the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, He gives us spiritual nourishment.

Have we forgotten the message of Jesus? "Peace be with you." Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." "To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." Permit the Holy Spirit to take control of your life. May we be rich in hope and the power of the Holy Spirit.
