Reflection for the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, by Deacon Steve Pulkrabek

There are many things in my life that I cannot grasp or understand. We can predict the weather by studying the weather patterns, but we are not able to control the weather. We are able to predict the probability of rain but not be assured that it will rain. In life we have knowledge, but we do not have the gifts to understand that which has been revealed by faith and science.

Today's feast invites us to live in the awareness of the presence of the Triune God within us: The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The mystery of the Holy Trinity, a doctrine, is one of the fundamental doctrines of Christianity and the greatest mystery of our Faith. Namely, that there are Three Divine Persons, sharing the same Divine nature in one God. The readings summarize the effects of the Trinity in our daily lives.

The Book of Proverbs reflects on Wisdom, a quality which that book identifies with God. St. Paul, in his Letter to the Romans, teaches us that we have peace with God the Father through Jesus Christ, and the faith poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit.

In today's Gospel, Jesus, the Son of God, mentions the role of the Holy Spirit, His close relationship with God the Father and what the Holy Spirit is going to do for us as we go about our daily tasks. God has revealed to us three separate functions that are carried out by the three Persons.

He has told us that it is proper to attribute to God the Father the work of creation; to God the Son, the work of Redemption, of reconciliation and of healing, and to the Holy Spirit, the work of guidance in truth, in the work of teaching and in the work of sanctification. If we search deep into the truth of our Faith, we can see that it offers all that we will ever need in our life on earth and for eternity.

As we celebrate this Trinity Sunday, on the relationships to which God has called you. How completely do you imitate the love of the Trinity in your relationships? Certainly, we will all find areas in which to grow. Make a commitment to take another step deeper and, in that step of love, allow God to give you a greater fulfillment as a result.


