

Reflection for the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, by Deacon Steve Pulkrabek

Happy Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, our Lord and God! What a Gift we celebrate today! The Eucharist is everything. It's all things, the fullness of life, eternal salvation, mercy, grace, happiness, etc. Why is the Eucharist all this and so much more? Simply put, the Eucharist IS God. Period. Therefore, the Eucharist is all that God is.

This statement of faith reveals that when we worship before the Holy Eucharist, we worship God Himself hidden under the appearance of bread and wine. What we see, taste and feel do not reveal the reality before us. The Holy Eucharist is God.

Throughout our lives, if we were raised Catholic, we were taught reverence for the Eucharist. But "reverence" is not enough. Most Catholics revere the Eucharist, meaning, we genuflect, kneel, and treat the Sacred Host with respect. But it's important to ponder a question in your heart.

Do you believe the Eucharist is God Almighty, the Savior of the world, the second Person of the Most Holy Trinity? Do you believe deeply enough to have your heart moved with love and profound devotion every time you are before our divine Lord present before us under the veil of the Eucharist? As St Thomas Aquinas once wrote and is as applicable today as it was in the 13th Century: "O sacred banquet, in which Christ is received, the memory of His Passion is renewed, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us."

I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world. John 6:51

Jesus has made Himself the Bread of Life to give us life. Night and day, He is there. If you really want to grow in love, come back to the Eucharist, come back to that Adoration.



THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

The National Eucharistic Revival officially begins on Corpus Christi Sunday. It is a direct response to the Holy Father's call for a "pastoral and missionary conversion which cannot leave things as they presently are," so that the Church in the United States might be "permanently in a state of mission" (Evangelii Gaudium, n. 25).

The Revival is a three-year initiative sponsored by the Bishops of the United States to form, heal convert, and unite the People of God through a renewed encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—and then to send these "Eucharistic missionaries" out to a hurting and hungry world. The milestone of the Revival will be a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, IN from July 17-21, 2024.


