Christian Marriage

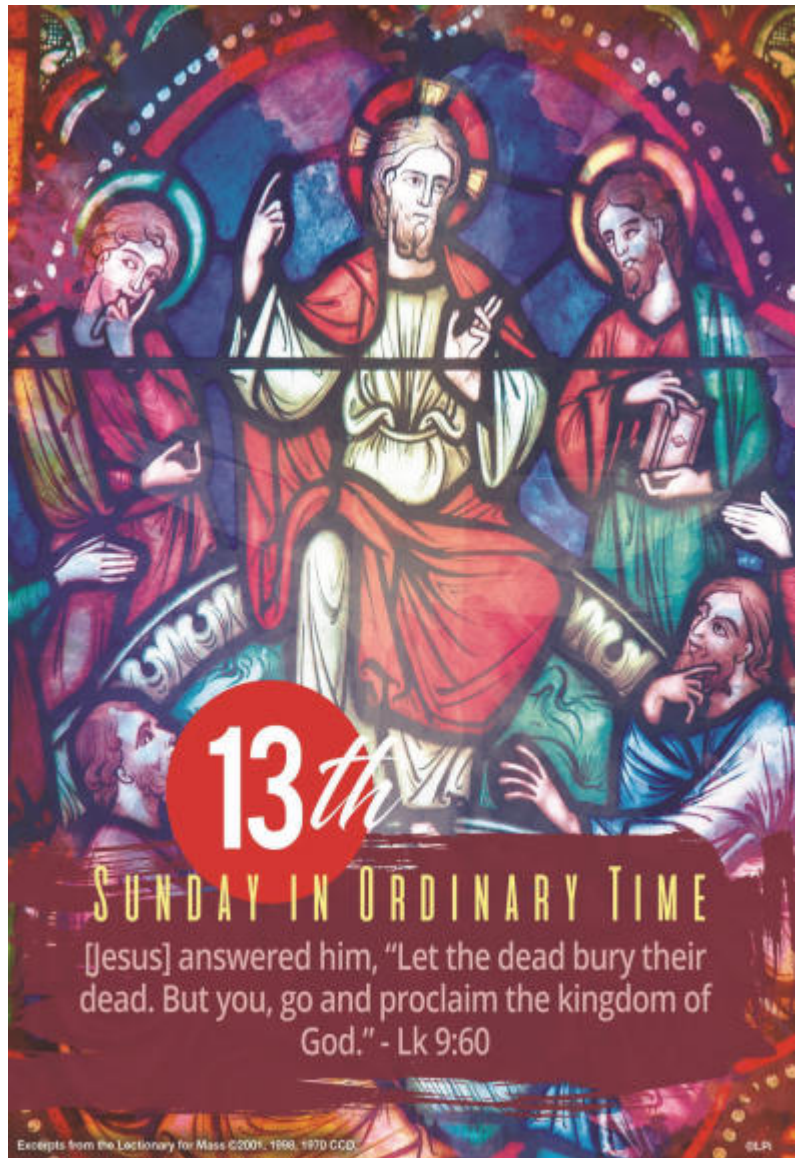
Couples should contact the Pastor at least six months in advance. Couples should include Archdiocesan Marriage Preparation Course in their plans.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

"No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God."

Jesus' words may seem a bit harsh but are directly on target. The life of discipleship can be costly. Upholding the tenets of the Gospel can put us at odds, even with those most close to us. Jesus never misses an opportunity to spend time with outcasts and sinners. It matters little to him whether doing so breaks a Sabbath law. The Gospel may seem unrealistic, but it is the Gospel nonetheless. We respect the dignity of all persons, from conception to natural death. We work on behalf of justice, which calls us to be with the poor, lonely, confused, and broken. The old "eye for an eye" mentality no longer applies when it comes to dealing with those who hurt us.

When Jesus asks you to follow him, will you go?

Eternal God, stir our minds and stimulate our hearts with a high sense of patriotism on this Fourth of July. May all that this day symbolizes renew our faith in freedom, our devotion to democracy, and redouble our efforts to keep a government of the people, by the people, and for the people truly alive in our world.

From the Shared Pastor's Desk:

Ordinary Time – Wasting time is almost a sin in our society; we're ruled by the clock because time is money and must be filled with purposeful controlled activities which produce value and things to be sold; as such, we're also convinced that we must be in control of time. In addition, we also find ourselves among the bored, those hypnotized by routine; we experience life as hum-drum sameness day in and day out; now wonder we crave the different, the new & exciting as a diversion from cyclical sameness. The Church has a 33 to 34 week-long season called "Ordinary Time" that, while no particular aspect of the mystery of our salvation in Christ is celebrated, this mystery is gradually spread out for our consideration on a 'Sunday by Sunday' basis. While special seasons like Advent/Christmas, Lent/Easter, may get more of our anticipation and attention, Ordinary Time exists so that our faithful participation in Mass each Sunday may help our appreciation for the grace of a relationship with God in and through His Son, Jesus Christ, keep growing. One of our kids at a youth ministry program recently asked, "Will God love me less if I don't go to Mass every week?" While a part of the answer is, of course, **yes**, as God is love and never stops being Who God is for us, the remaining portion of the answer is that, until we participate in Mass faithfully every Sunday, we'll never fully comprehend how strong, faithful and great God's love for us really is. See you in Church, especially during these Ordinary Times ...

Wondering About Religion – A good number of fine people wonder why religions, meant to be a source of comfort, truth and joy, can cause so much conflict and pain, especially with so many different ones making what seem to be so many different claims. Why is this, especially if there is truly One God Who is Father of all and we are all His children? In considering this always contemporary concern, I like to compare religions to diamonds; each one will be of a great value to the person who finds it; in their natural/rough state, every diamond requires refinement, some cutting and a polishing, in order to reveal their many facets and greater brilliance. Every religion contains glimmers, partial truths, and portions of God's wisdom. The Catholic Church believes that God has fully revealed Himself by sending His Own Son and that there will be no further revelation after Him; He is God's definitive Word. We also believe that God has entrusted the fullness of His truth to us in all its richness, the Holy Spirit guiding, instructing, and keeping the Church as a whole from erring on matters of faith and morals. This doesn't mean that individuals and small groups of people who are part of any religion cannot misapply, misinterpret or misunderstand the truth that God has made available to everyone through created things, Scripture and Tradition. The fact of many religions is a mystery. It has something to do with human freedom as well as the natural conditions of human religious and cultural development. For thousands of years the main human groups lived in relative isolation from each other – Europe, Asia, Americas and Africa. Today we experience life in a more interconnected way than ever. As this interconnectedness is a relatively new experience in human history, there are various tensions and violent conflicts between people based on differences that aren't yet understood. Religion should be a source and force for greater harmony and justice, and has responsibility to be a way in which people can come together.
