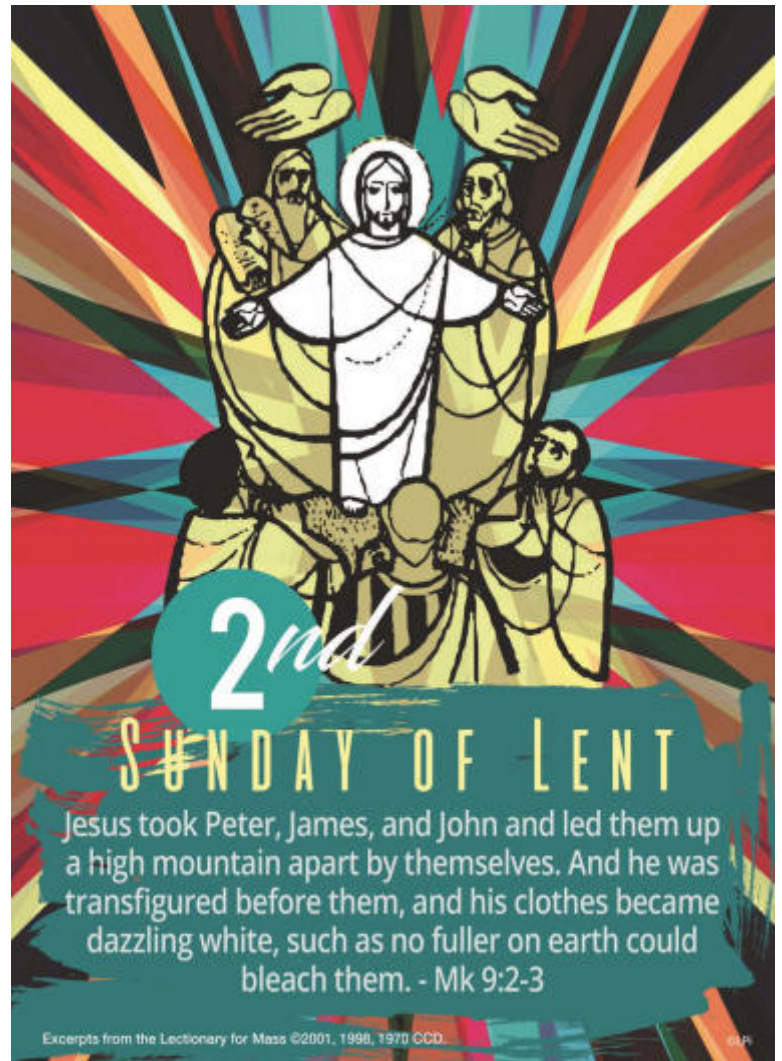

## LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

How is your Lent going so far? In changing the circumstances and order of our lives a bit, perhaps we can hear God's voice more clearly and drink more deeply of graced moments we experience. Having God as a friend always involves several things. First, there is God's call. We become attuned to the echo of God's voice in the depth of our souls calling and beckoning us to listen. Second, there is a request. We begin to see that God asks us to do certain things, to order our lives a particular way, and become more intentional in the choices we make. Third, there is trust. Do we trust this call and request? Trust commits us to the relationship and makes a claim on who we are. Finally, we are asked to act. We find ourselves acting, not in the way we used to, but in a transformed, more enlightened way. Things seem clearer and all that is around us shines with the brilliance of God's presence. God's call came through a cloud, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him," This is the call and the request. Can we give God our trust and do as God asks?

**You May Have Noticed** – Beginning Ash Wednesday, February 17, the USCCB Committee on Divine Worship in accord with the Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments made a change in wording for the conclusion of the collects (opening prayers) in the Roman Missal and other liturgical books. Instead of the priest saying "(...) **in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever**" the priest will now simply say "(...) **in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, forever and ever.**" While some may not see what difference this small change makes, there is significance, especially in today's world filled with religious pluralism, to carefully affirming this Christological truth. Participation aids to help the faithful at Mass will carry this change as soon as possible, but since many of these are printed well in advance and sometimes on an annual basis, it will take some time for this change to appear in print. The new conclusion is easy to apply (please be patient with your priests because, as you know, old habits are hard to break) and shouldn't affect the ability of the faithful to respond with a heartfelt and strong "Amen."

**From the Shared Pastor's Desk (Father Rick):**

**Catholic Stewardship Appeal 2020: Final Report** – States we raised \$22,694 toward goal of \$33,360, meeting 67.42% of our goal from 86 donor participants representing 33.08% of our registered membership, the highest percentage of participation in our cluster parishes; thank you! As our goal has not been changed in years, we requested an adjusted goal for 2021. Archdiocesan-wide the Appeal received \$9,463,628 toward \$8.1 million goal from 29,454 donors, and first progress report from 2021 Catholic Stewardship Appeal now underway will be given later; thank you very much!

**Renewed Appointment** – In addition to my duties as “Shared Pastor” for our cluster parishes, Archbishop Listecki has seen fit to renew my appointment as DEAN for the priests of Dodge and Washington counties until end June of 2022; as the pandemic has seen many extensions of existing appointments to service, this is nothing unusual or particularly meritorious; I am pleased and willing to continue to serve the Archbishop in this capacity.

**St. Katharine Drexel** – American-born in 1858, a child of extremely affluent, well-educated parents who were devout and charitable (her father saw to it that the entire family attended daily Mass, spent ½ hour daily in quiet prayer and opened their home to the poor three days a week), this lively, attractive young woman was prepared to take a place among the elite but was disinterested and unenthusiastic about elaborate social expectations, including a marriage. When her step-mother (her birth-mother had died five weeks after Katharine’s birth) and her father both died within two years of one another, she and her two sisters inherited 90% of his vast estate, the other 10% being directed to charity. Her share of the estate was \$7 million! Knowing money could not buy safety from pain, sickness or death, she decided to devote her fortune to the plights of minorities, particularly of Native and African Americans. As she began to donate aid to these causes, she began to realize the immensity of what was needed. While on European tour, she met Pope Leo XIII and asked him to send missionaries to Wyoming for the Native Americans. His reply, pert and spot-on, was “Why don’t you become a missionary?” After some thought, realizing that the considerable wealth with which she had been gifted could do much more if she personally directed the effort, she founded a new religious community, the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Indians and Colored, to establish schools and missions; by 1942, despite the opposition of segregationists, she had established a system of black Catholic schools in 13 states, plus 40 missions & 23 rural schools, along with 50 missions for Native Americans in 16 states. Of particular note is a college she opened in Louisiana in 1915, later chartered as XAVIER UNIVERSITY, one of the first to admit and welcome people of color for higher education! Katharine, despite prevailing custom & laws of the time, took exception to segregation, decried prejudice; while not uninterested in the “civil rights movement,” she was more passionately devoted to being able to bring the life of grace, the spiritual food of the Eucharist, and the great hope of God’s word to minorities as they struggled against what we now call “systemic racism.” Her efforts brought a whole generation of American Catholics an awareness of the needs of minorities. In 1935, she suffered a severe heart attack and retired to live the next 20 years contemplatively and prayerfully. When she died in 1955 at age 96, it was the decade marked by civil rights campaigns led by Dr. Martin Luther King. She was beatified in 1988 and canonized in 2000. What remained of her estate she left not to her religious community but directly to the missions and schools they operated, feeling her sisters should be self-supporting! A little rich girl found a way to give as a gift what she herself had received as a gift ... her feast day is Wednesday, March 03, especially noteworthy in the Beaver Dam parish named after her. Pray for us!
