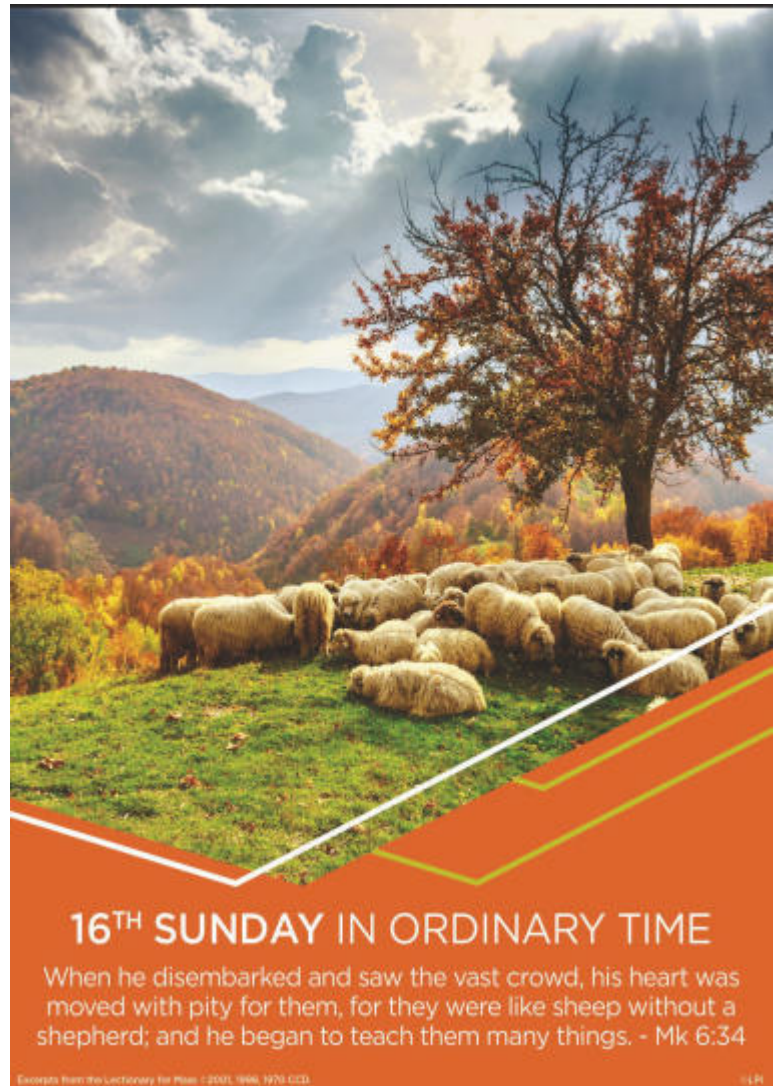
Couples should contact the Pastor at least six months in

## LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

We only have so much psychological and spiritual energy. We easily get tired. Responding to life's demands and people's needs can really zap us of all our energy. Anger, frustration, exhaustion, discouragement, helplessness, and even apathy can run wild. We can find ourselves bitter and irritated by the fact that we have to do it all again. We need to rest, connect, and focus. Deserted places, free of unnecessary distractions and demands, are great places of refreshment and we all need them. Desiring to be alone for a bit and rest does not indicate selfishness. Rather, it radiates wisdom. God is the source of all we do and the satisfaction of every human heart. If we are going to wisely use the gifts God gave us, then we have to make sure our batteries are recharged and replenished. Jesus invites us to go to a deserted place to rest and pray. Where is yours?



**From the Shared Pastor's Desk (Father Rick):**

**St. Mary Magdalene** – Is commemorated Thursday, July 22; except for Mary, Mother of God, few women are more honored in Holy Scripture than her despite persistent legends that she was the repentant who washed the feet of Jesus and dried them with her hair (hence the long, flowing hair by which she is recognized in Stations of the Cross) while he was at dinner in the house of Simon the Pharisee (Luke 7:38). According to misidentifications in a long-standing tradition, she was said to be a flamboyantly immoral woman with a notorious reputation and given to extravagant, emotional display (recall her uninhibited embrace of Jesus outside His garden tomb Easter Sunday morning that led Jesus to affectionately request she stop “clinging” to Him!). What Scripture does say is that Jesus cast out 7 demons from her (this could have meant an exorcism or that He healed her of epilepsy which was thought to be caused by a demonic possession) and, out of gratitude, she assisted Jesus and the Twelve with their ministry “out of her means.” She stood by the Cross of Jesus with Mary, His mother, Mary, His mother’s sister, the wife of Clopas, and St. John. Chosen as privileged first witness to the Risen Lord, she is called “Apostle to the Apostles.”

**Funerals** – Our churches have had an unusual high number of funerals thus far this year – funeral directors say they also have been somewhat overwhelmed with need for their services while noting a growing shortage of directors to serve in their line of work. Something I occasionally hear bereaved families say is it’s hard to come back to church as here they visualize their loss. While grief will always be among the most challenging experiences we’ll endure and being in the place where a funeral was held can be difficult, our faith tells us that we do not grieve like the rest who have no hope (1 Thessalonians 4:13). How is this so? In the Old Testament death was a radical break with others and God. Now, because Jesus at the Last Supper changed the meaning of death (not a “being taken away” but more an “offering up”), we no longer consider it in a totally negative way. Death still breaks the physical bonds between people. We no longer can communicate as we did before with someone who is now dead. It serves no purpose to speak to a dead person. We no longer have a reciprocal relationship. This makes us feel sad. But we also know that all our bonds are not broken. In Christ, we’re still spiritually united with those who have died. Baptism permanently connected our lives with Jesus through a watery sharing in His Holy Death and Resurrection; that connection is made new every time we receive one or another of His Sacraments in which we truly encounter His never-ending love for us; this occurs pre-eminently when receiving Holy Communion wherein Christ joins Himself most intimately to us by sharing His Body, Blood, Soul & Divinity with us for the sake of both our bodies and immortal souls. As we pray and believe that our beloved dead pass through death into new life and are with Jesus, then wherever and whenever we are most united with Jesus (at Mass, in the Sacraments, at Eucharistic Adoration) we are also most connected with those we personally, physically miss. If we do not grieve like the rest who have no hope it is because of Jesus Whom death no longer has any power over! It may well be that the best place to be as we grieve our losses is **in church and at Mass, receiving Holy Communion**, for, whenever we’re nearest Jesus, we’re nearest those we miss because they are with Him, their eternal life and our salvation; something to ponder ...

The Archdiocese of Milwaukee Office of Diaconate Formation will be holding an information session at St. Sebastian, 5400 W. Washington Blvd, Milwaukee on Monday, July 26 from 6-7:00 PM.
