Christian Marriage


Couples should contact the Pastor at least six months in advance. Couples should include Archdiocesan Marriage Preparation Course in their plans.

<u>LIVE THE LITURGY -</u> <u>INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK</u>

Life can be challenging and frightening. Sometimes, it really hurts to be a human being. We face brokenness of all kinds: physical, emotional, and spiritual. For no apparent reason, life can quickly fall apart. What we knew to be familiar is gone and something we relied upon is taken away. We are left sitting with our incompleteness and swimming in the pools of our sadness. Be strong! Fear not! These admonitions flow from the mouths of prophets and are echoed by Jesus. It is difficult to trust that restoration, healing, and rejuvenation will one day come, and remain steadfast in our faith. But we are here because of a God who loves us, not as the result of a random occurrence. When we reach for that truth about who we are and who God is, life changes for us. We are healed from our old distorted way of seeing things. Our eyes, heart, and soul are opened to the beauty and magnificence of life. The pulse of our loving Creator is felt in all things and we can't wait for God to come and touch us again. God made us, God loves us, and God keeps us. He has done all things well.

From the Shared Associate Pastor's Desk (Fr. Jonathon):

VIRTUES – Part 7. So far in this series on the virtues, we have focused on the four cardinal virtues (sometimes called the 'human virtues' or 'moral virtues'). In this article, we now make a shift from those human virtues to what are called the **theological virtues**. The theological virtues are: faith, hope, and love. We will focus first on these three virtues in general, and in the next article, begin to focus on each of them individually. To begin, I will quote at length from the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* because it summarizes the theological virtues far better than I could possibly do. The theological virtues:

"dispose Christians to live a relationship with the Holy Trinity. They have One and Triune God as their origin, motive and object." (CCC 1812).

Going on it says:

"The theological virtues are the foundation of Christian moral activity... They are infused by God into the souls of the faithful to make them capable of acting as his children and of meriting eternal life. They are a pledge and action of the Holy Spirit in the faculties of the human being." (CCC 1813)

The difference between the human virtues and the theological virtues is this: The theological virtues are first and foremost a **gift from God**. Certainly, it's a gift that has to be unwrapped and used. It's a gift that takes time to learn how to make best use of it and to allow it to grow. But, it's essential to understand that faith, hope and love begin with God's generosity, not ours.

On September 8, we celebrate the Nativity of Mary. In the Latin Rite, we don't celebrate very many birthdays in the liturgical calendar. Mostly, we celebrate those of Jesus, Mary, and St John the Baptist. Celebrating Mary's birthday again calls us to remember the great things that God has done in Mary. It reminds us to ask for her help so that we can become better friends with her Son each day of our lives. It would be fitting to have a piece of cake, too, to help us celebrate this great Feast in our homes and with our children.

You may have noticed over the course of the summer, that we have been slowly been making a return to having **servers** assisting at Mass again. If your child has made his or her First Communion and want to become a server, please reach out to me (or Joel Schodron at St. Peter) for training or re-training – as we hope to put together a regular schedule and sign-up for servers.

On a final note, I hope that all of our students have had a good first few days of school!


