Christian Marriage


Couples should contact the Pastor at least six months in advance. Couples should include Archdiocesan Marriage Preparation Course in their plans.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Jesus stood in line with everyone else and was baptized. There is something incredibly humbling about how this must have played out. Then, God did something truly awesome and inspiring. Through a very gentle and simple action he let the world know about the special relationship He shares with Jesus. That's exactly what is so incredible about our baptisms as well! Through those holy waters God announces to the world the special place we also occupy in His heart. We no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. We do not need to fumble around, tripping over ourselves and wondering why we are even here. The answer has been given. All we have to do is live out the vocation we have received, to live the Gospel in fidelity to our Creator. There is nothing to fear and worry has no place. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor and God is very pleased.

Sunday, January 9, 2021 *The Baptism of the Lord*

From the Shared Associate Pastor's Desk (Fr. Jonathon):

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. In the Gospel of the Mass, we hear the story of when Jesus comes to John the Baptist and asks to be baptized by him. Because Saint John the Baptist recognizes, at least somewhat, who Jesus is – he recognizes his unworthiness to provide such a grand service to our Lord. Yet, our Lord uses him to bring forth the great Sacrament. By doing so, He sanctifies ordinary water as a most powerful instrument to cleanse us of our sins and unite us to Himself. Today, let us give thanks to God for the great things He has done in our lives through our Baptism.

Today is the last official day of the season of Christmas. I wish you and your family a very blessed and joyful Christmas again! A very sincere thank-you for all of you sent so many very kind words, cards, photos, gifts, and baked goods you have sent my way in these past few weeks. Your kindness and generosity means a lot to me!

We return to Ordinary Time again this week. When the Church refers to this liturgical season as "ordinary", she is not saying that it is a time of dullness, boredom, or perpetual monotony. Rather, "ordinary" is closer to the word "ordered". In other words, in these ordinary weeks between now and the start of Lent (on March 2 this year), we are supposed to learn how to "order" or organize our lives around Jesus Christ. The means to do so are the same as ever: weekly Mass, daily prayer, and a regular confession. Even though we may have already dropped some of our New Year's resolutions, perhaps we can take up these good Christian practices to organize our lives to be more closely united to God.

On a personal note, I want to share some news in my life. You may have already heard this news – either at Mass, through the grapevines, or counting the years. In June 2022, I will be moving on to a new parish assignment. Typically, associate pastors in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee are assigned for a three year term. Those three years somehow have already come and gone by – and very quickly! But as I've told people who are saddened by this news, "You will probably like the new guy even more!" This I can say with great honesty – because I'm well aware of my faults and foibles! Plus, I'm still here for a long while yet. There is much more work to be done, Sacraments to celebrate, homilies to preach, and desserts to eat before we will part! Please keep in your prayers as I begin this time of transition and change!


