Why do we keep our Christmas decorations up so long?

In the old rite tradition of "Christmastide" the Christmas season lasted for forty days beginning December 25th, The Nativity and ending on February 2nd, with the Purification of Mary. February 2nd is also known as "Candlemas". The custom of celebrating the solemnity of our Savior's nativity by a feast of 40 days' duration is founded on the Holy Gospel; for it tells us that the Blessed Virgin Mary, after spending 40 days in the contemplation of the divine fruit of her glorious maternity, went to the temple, there to fulfill, in most perfect humility, the ceremonies which the law demanded of the daughters of Israel when they became mothers. The feast of Mary's purification is, therefore, part of that of Jesus' birth; and the custom of keeping this holy and glorious period of forty days as one continued festival. The feast in the new rite is called the Presentation of the Lord, same joyful event - just a different emphasis. So, enjoy the season as they did in the past and keep your decorations up until Candlemas!



LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Prophets possess an intimate knowledge of God and act on their experience of God. Prophetic messages usually challenge the status quo and draw us up and out of ourselves, focusing us on the bigger picture. We often think of ourselves and our own needs first. When we listen to someone speak, we judge the merit of the message by its degree of usefulness. If the message or vision contains no personal benefit or profit but a call to stretch and grow, we can become indignant. Prophets are usually the ones whose message challenges us and calls us to see things differently and love more perfectly and deeply. God is love. When listening to St. Paul speak about love we witness the unfolding of this type of unconditional, other centered, self-sacrificial perfect God. It is an invitation to life, freedom, and happiness that can be offered to us only by God. Jesus, who is God and Love incarnate, calls us to this richer expression of love. Are we ready to listen and be challenged and stretched?

The Presentation of the Lord/St. Blaise Blessing – Will be observed as follows: Candles will be blessed for church/home use on Wednesday, February 02, during regular morning and evening Masses; the St. Blaise blessing of throats will be offered on his feast day, Thursday, February 03, again during regular morning and evening Masses; the St. Blaise blessing will also be offered on the weekend of February 05-06 after all cluster parish Masses and blessed candles for home use will then also be available for recommended free-will offerings.

The 2021 Catholic Stewardship Appeal – Reports continuing progress: we're just shy of original goal of \$33,660 by 27.47%, showing us \$9,245 short of making it, from 85 donors representing slightly over 33% of our registered members; all I can say is "wow" & thanks for your awesome percentage of participation & generosity! Archdiocesan-wide the original goal of \$8.1 has been exceeded with 29,491 donors giving \$9,026,632; thanks for being such a part of this success!

Support Groups – Times are tough. COVID, the political situation in America today, challenges to our faith, and the economy have all put tremendous pressure on us and families. Resources to help with spiritual challenges, mental or emotional struggles, are currently quite insufficient. Under the auspices of the Catholic parishes of West Bend, a professional counselor will start up free professionally led support groups for those dealing with stress, depression, anxiety, family or relationship problems, confusion, spiritual concerns and etc. Interested persons may apply at <u>http://tinyurl.com/2p8jnd7p</u> or

Collective Mass Intentions – With not as many Masses @ nursing homes and many more deaths this past year than usual, we've experienced a significant shortage of dates/times for which we can accept and fulfill offerings for Mass Intentions. Given this, we'll begin to implement a lawful solution called "Collective Mass Intentions." When all weekend & weekday intentions are filled, our secretaries are allowed to add an intention 2X weekly at each parish in a given week (these may **not** be added to Masses designated FOR THE PEOPLE (PRO POPULO) for any reason; these are required by Canon Law to be said without any offering 1X weekly on rotation as determined by the pastor). Additional Intentions will be publicized in the bulletin; as all whose offerings are to be combined with others must be informed and freely give consent to having a Mass with the multiple intentions, please notify us only if you prefer **<u>not</u>** to share this way; otherwise, we will accept silence as consent and begin this practice in February. Priests celebrating Mass for which multiple intentions have been accepted still receive only one offering, additional offerings given to charity as directed by the Archbishop.
