Thank you to everyone who has helped make our PSR go so smoothly this year. It really is a joy to see the children and I know they've all been enjoying it and looking forward to it each week.

The Altar of Repose will be set up for November. Because November is the month we make extra effort to remember our deceased, we always set up an altar of repose. If you have a loved one who has died this past year or is not already in our book, feel free to add names. We also have a book with the names of miscarried babies to remember in our prayers that you may add names to. Any pictures you would like to contribute to the altar are most welcome.

We are now beginning our 25th week of being back at Mass together - approximately **262 Masses total**. We have had **zero incidents** of community transmission of coronavirus, flu, or norovirus. There is no such thing as a zero risk environment - there never has been - but our common sense approach to staying healthy and safe is working just fine. Thank you all for continuing to respect each other. We have also been running our PSR since the 1st week of September with no incidents.

We have 4 weekend masses per week, so 25 weeks means we've had 100 weekend masses since May 18. If you were to attend just one per week, that's 2 years of Sunday masses safely attended.

We are looking for Readers to read the Scriptures at weekend Masses. We have a LOT of new faces at our Masses and it would be great to get involved in this small way. So the duties don't become too burdensome, the goal is that we would not schedule you more than once-per month (for some it would be even less, depending on the Mass you attend). We are most in need of readers for Saturday 4 pm, so if you attend that Mass we would very much appreciate the help. Email me with questions or to let me know your interest. Thanks!

Learning the Mass - Signs of the Cross

During the Extraordinary Form of the Mass, the sign of the cross is made over the bread and wine by the priest many times. St. Thomas Aquinas says that every sign of the cross is placed "strategically" to coincide with whenever the mystery of Christ's sacrifice is mentioned.

First is Christ's betrayal, signified by the triple sign of the cross at the words, "These gifts, these presents, these holy unspotted sacrifices."

Second is the selling of Christ by Judas. To signify this the threefold sign of the cross is repeated at the words, "Blessed, enrolled, ratified."

Third is the foreshadowing of the Passion at the Last Supper. Two crosses are made, one in consecrating the Body, the other in consecrating the Blood while saying, "He blessed..."

Fourth is Christ's Passion. To represent His five wounds, there is a fivefold signing of the cross at the words, "a pure Victim, a holy Victim, a spotless Victim, the holy bread of eternal life, and the cup of everlasting salvation."

Fifth, the outstretching of Christ's body, the shedding of blood, and the fruits of the Passion are signified by the triple signing of the cross at the words, "As many as shall receive the body and blood, may be filled with every blessing."

Sixth, Christ's threefold prayer upon the Cross is represented - a prayer for His persecutors when He said, "Father, forgive them," another for deliverance from death when He cried, "My God, My God, why hast Thou forsaken Me?" a third referring to His entrance into glory when He said, "Father, into Thy hands I commend My spirit." To denote these there is a triple signing with the cross made at the words, "Thou dost sanctify, quicken, bless."

Seventh, the three hours during which He hung upon the cross are represented with a triple sign of the cross at the words, "Through Him, and with Him, and in Him."

Eighth, the separation of His soul from the body is signified by the two subsequent crosses made over the chalice.

Ninth, the resurrection on the third day is represented by the three crosses made at the words, "May the peace of the Lord be ever with you."

Here's the current Marian Hymn after Mass

Salve Regina, mater misericordiae, vita, dulcedo, et spes nostra salve. Ad te clamamus, exules filii Evae. Ad te suspiramus, gementes et flentes, in hac lacrimarum valle. Eia ergo, advocate nostra, illos tuos misericordes oculos, ad nos converte. Et Jesum, benedictum fructum ventris tui, nobis post hoc exilium ostende. O Clemens, o pia, o dulcis virgo Maria.

Virtual Trivia - Tips & Tricks for Participating

- ◆ **Register a Team Captain & start recruiting your team:** LASM's Virtual Trivia Night will require registration in advance by the Team Captain through the Google Form by visiting: <https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAIpQLSe8HQv-0SrH9eIscMVhHBI4HMOCnAnNQm1id-P6CYug-kjzKw/viewform> OR by calling the LASM Office at 314-647-4591. Registration will require email addresses of the Team Captain and Team Players so that we can share the Zoom link instructions for participating. Team size is up to 8 players/devices.
- ◆ **Download Zoom on Your Device & Test:** When joining a Zoom meeting from a link, you will be prompted to download and launch Zoom Meetings. From a phone/tablet you can install the Zoom App (free). You can do this in advance of the meeting time by clicking the link provided to you. For the best experience, we recommend playing from a computer since we know its is easier to operate.
- ◆ **How It Will Work:** LASM's Virtual Trivia Night will start out with all teams/players together in a "main Zoom meeting" for announcements, then it will move into "Zoom breakout rooms" to solve trivia questions together within your own teams. The team captain (or designated scribe) should record all the team's answers while in the breakout room. Breakout rooms will then be closed and everyone returned to the main Zoom room. The MC will read the answers to the group. Each team Captain (or designated scribe) will score their teams answers and submit the team's final score via the "Chat" button in the middle of the tool bar at the bottom of the screen. (i.e. "Round 1, Team 3, 8 pts"). Scoring will be done on the honor system.
- ◆ **Once You Have Joined - You Must Rename Yourself! - VERY IMPORTANT!** In order for us to get you into your Zoom breakout room ("room" where you'll answer trivia questions with your team), we must know your team number!
