Learning the Mass - Ashes (From Romano Guardini's Sacred Signs)

ON the edge of the woods grows a larkspur. Its glorious blue blossom rising on its bending stalk from among the dark green curiously-shaped leaves fills the air with color. A passerby picks the flower, loses interest in it and throws it into the fire, and in a short moment all that is left of that splendid show is a thin streak of grey ash.

What fire does in an instant, time is always doing to everything that lives. The delicate fern, the stout mullein, the root-ed oak, butterflies, darting swallows, nimble squirrels, heavy oxen, all of them, equally, sooner or later, by accident, disease, hunger, cold,--all these clear-cut forms, all this flourishing life, turns to a little ash, a handful of dry dust, which every breeze scatters this way and that. All this brilliant color, all this sensitive, breathing life, falls into pale, feeble, dead earth, and less than earth, into ashes. It is the same with ourselves. We look into an opened grave and shiver: a few bones, a handful of ash-grey dust.

Remember man
that dust thou art
and unto dust shalt thou return.

Ashes signify man's overthrow by time. Our own swift passage, ours and not someone else's, ours, mine. When at the beginning of Lent the priest takes the burnt residue of the green branches of the last Palm Sunday and inscribes with it on my forehead the sign of the cross, it is to remind me of my death.

Memento homo
quia pulvis
est et in pulverem reverteris.

Everything turns to ashes, everything whatever. This house I live in, these clothes I am wearing, my household stuff, my money, my fields, meadows, woods, the dog that follows me, my horse in his stall, this hand I am writing with, these eyes that read what I write, all the rest of my body, people I have loved, people I have hated, or been afraid of, whatever was great in my eyes upon earth, whatever small and contemptible, all without exception will fall back into dust.

Here's the current Marian Hymn after Mass -

Salve Regina, mater misericordiae, vita, dulcedo, et spes nostra salve. Ad te clamamus, exules filii Evae. Ad te suspiramus, gementes et flentes, in hac lacrimarum valle. Eia ergo, advocate nostra, illos tuos misericordes oculos, ad nos converte. Et Jesum, benedictum fructum ventris tui, nobis post hoc exilium ostende. O Clemens, o pia, o dulcis virgo Maria.


For decades, Congress has protected your money from paying for abortion. Now, some powerful government officials are trying to change that.

BILLIONS in Abortion Funding WITHOUT THE HYDE AMENDMENT


- Without the Hyde Amendment and related policies, billions of taxpayer dollars could be used to pay for abortions in the U.S. and overseas.
- Getting rid of the amendment would likely lead to many more lives lost through abortion [7].
- States' health benefits would likely be held hostage. States would be forced to either include elective abortion in Medicaid or be kicked out of the federal Medicaid program.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: What kind of religious practices should we begin, once we marry, to help us practice our faith each day?

Answer:

Your spiritual life as a couple is important. The sacrament of Marriage is a gift and a grace, but living it well isn't always easy! It requires intentionality and perseverance. Growing your spiritual life as a couple also requires a plan. Life can be incredibly busy. There's never "enough time" for everything we want to do. But we can live by our priorities. If we don't prioritize prayer, we'll find it slowly disappear from our lives.

If you're not already praying individually, that's a good place to start. If your schedules are similar, take some quiet time at the same time to help hold each other accountable. Praying together is also important! You could start by looking at the religious practices of your family and of families around you that you respect. Talk with your spouse about the ones who make the deepest impression on you or were most meaningful when you were young. Think about what you want your future children to experience. Making faith a commitment now will mean it is engrained habit when you grow your family. Ultimately, these faith practices should help us grow in our love for God and for one another.

Care Service Celebrates 40 years of helping homeless and hungry

Later this month Sts. Joachim and Ann Care Service will celebrate a major milestone—its 40th Anniversary.

The nonprofit agency had its start on July 26, 1981 with just \$500, five volunteers and a mission to serve the poor. Over the last four decades, the agency has assisted thousands of local families in crisis. Families were fed. Homes were saved. The homeless were housed.

“Over the last 40 years our agency has grown and expanded from a food pantry operating from a volunteer’s garage to a full-service comprehensive social service agency with 32 employees and a nearly \$3 million budget,” said Executive Director Pam Struckhoff. “Through our integrated programs, the Care Service has helped families stay in their homes, ensured that families had enough to eat, and helped the homeless become housed.”

To celebrate this momentous occasion, the Care Service invites the community to an outdoor event on Saturday, July 24 from 5:30 pm to 8:30 pm on its campus at 4116 McClay Road. The event will feature live music by the Charlie Mann Trio, free ice cream from Freddy’s Frozen Custard for the first 100 guests, free outdoor games for adults and children, temporary tattoos, a magic show, and an inflatable obstacle course. The first 100 guests will also be entered in several special raffles. Food trucks and draught beer will be on-site and available for purchase.

“While we have made great strides in serving St. Charles, Lincoln and Warren counties, there is still more work to be done,” said Struckhoff. “Hundreds of individuals in the area are currently homeless. About 30% of tri-county population is facing food insecurity. We will continue in our mission ‘to serve those in crisis and prevent homelessness and hunger’ until families don’t have to worry about choosing between feeding their family and paying the rent.”

About Sts. Joachim and Ann Care Service

Driven by its mission “to serve those in crisis and to prevent homelessness and hunger,” Sts. Joachim and Ann Care Service works with the most vulnerable families and individuals in St. Charles, Lincoln and Warren counties to address the individual needs of each family in crisis through its integrated programs and services. The Care Service can provide financial housing and utility assistance through its Housing Assistance Program to help families avoid an eviction, prevent a utility disconnect, or pay for a deposit on a new place. The Children and Family Development (CFD) Program provides families with children who are homeless or are at-risk of becoming homeless with comprehensive case management. The agency’s weekly Client Choice Food Pantry is open three days a week to provide clients with nutritious, supplemental food and basic hygiene items that can’t be purchased with food stamps. The annual Adopt-A-Family program provides holiday gifts for needy families in December. A Street Outreach team hits the streets four times a week to assist literally homeless individuals and families with basic survival and emergency needs while determining physical/mental health issues, with the ultimate goal of permanent housing placement.
