**Learning the Mass** - What is Sacred Music and what's appropriate for Mass?

The other day, I received an email from the Archdiocesan Office of Worship, offering guidance on music in our churches. I read it with great interest, because the first article was written by Epiphany's Organist at the Sunday night Mass. I thought it well worth reading. It's a bit long for the bulletin, so I'll break it into two parts so you can read it this week and next.

\*\*\*

The Liturgy is a gift that we receive from the Church and not something that we make for ourselves." This maxim is something that has stuck with me over the years when preparing music for Holy Mass and other sacred rites. It's really not a matter of what music that I want to play or what music I think others want me to play, but rather what music the Church is requiring us to play. Should the lector pick a favorite passage of scripture to read on Sunday, or worse, substitute a reading from some other source? No, because the Church prescribes what readings are to be read and when. Similarly, the Church tells us what sacred texts are to be sung and when. We don't have to invent anything or be overly creative. Every Mass has a set of ordinary and proper texts that are prescribed. The ordinary texts are those that don't change from one Mass to the next (Kyrie, Gloria, Credo, etc.) and the proper texts are those assigned to a particular day or feast. The manner of music is somewhat more complex in that while the Church does have prescribed melodies for certain texts, we are also free to substitute alternate or new melodies that are suitable.

The church also offers a great deal of latitude for various circumstances. While the pipe organ is the preferred instrument of the Church, not every parish or chapel can have one. Choirs are to be diligently promoted, but not every Mass must be celebrated with a choir. Ideally, the Mass should be sung throughout, but certain texts may be recited rather than sung. However, too often we abuse these concessions and allow something quite far from the ideal to be the norm. For example, every Mass is assigned an antiphon text that is to be sung during the Entrance, Offertory, and Communion processions. These texts may be sung to the original Gregorian melodies that have been associated with these texts for centuries, or newer or simpler melodies may be substituted. It is also possible to select another seasonally appropriate antiphon and psalm to substitute for the proper text. These antiphon texts are selected by the Church from sacred scripture and tradition. Singing these same texts year after year helps to teach the mysteries of the Faith and encourages full active and conscious participation.

Too often, we restrict ourselves to condensing all of our religious music-making to the Mass. There is enough to do at Mass without trying to incorporate all of our favorite hymns and songs. Why not sing our favorite hymns and songs at home with our family, or in schools, or at other parish meetings and functions? Perhaps listening to some of our favorite religious music in the car on the way to Mass (or afterward) would be a better transition between the sacred and secular realms rather than thoughtlessly listening to whatever popular music is playing on the radio (which is often not just secular, but anti-Christian—a topic for another article). Devotional hymns and popular religious songs can accomplish much in terms of catechesis and evangelization, but the liturgy, having its own prescribed music (as well as time for silence) should be allowed to speak for itself.

**Here's the current Marian Hymn after Mass -**

*Salve Regina, mater misericordiae, vita, dulcedo, et spes nostra salve. Ad te clamamus, exules filii Evae. Ad te suspiramus, gementes et flentes, in hac lacrimarum valle. Eia ergo, advocate nostra, illos tuos misericordes oculos, ad nos converte. Et Jesum, benedictum fructum ventris tui, nobis post hoc exilium ostende. O Clemens, o pia, o dulcis virgo Maria.*

Hail, holy Queen, mother of mercy,  
Hail our life, our sweetness, and our hope.  
To you we cry, poor banished children of Eve;  
to you we send up our sighs,  
mourning and weeping in this valley of tears.  
Turn, then, most gracious advocate,  
your eyes of mercy toward us;  
and after this, our exile,



## WHY DO WE DO THAT?

### CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

**Question:**

Are Catholics allowed to visit psychics? Why or why not?

**Answer:**

It's part of human nature to experience some sense of unease and fear about the future. This can lead some people to seek out the services of psychics or consult horoscopes or turn to other occult practices or resources (e.g. Ouija boards or tarot cards). The Catechism of the Catholic Church is very clear that Catholics should avoid such practices: "Consulting horoscopes, astrology, palm reading, interpretation of omens and lots, the phenomena of clairvoyance, and recourse to mediums all conceal a desire for power over time, history, and, in the last analysis, other human beings, as well as a wish to conciliate hidden powers. They contradict the honor, respect, and loving fear that we owe to God alone" (no. 2116). Despite the uncertainties we might feel, we are called to have faith and trust in God, confident of God's desire for what is best for us. This means that we are called to surrender, to pray and to reflect on how we can best move into the future in hope, knowing that God is with us.
