SVDP 2021 CONFERENCE SUMMARY

On behalf of the St. Thomas Aquinas parish conference of St. Vincent de Paul, Happy New Year! Our SVdP conference has just completed an active, productive and challenging year serving members of our community, and I am pleased to provide this summary of our activities in 2021.

Inspired by Gospel values, The Society of St Vincent de Paul leads women and men to join together to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person services to those who are needy and suffering. Due to the continuing COVID-19 pandemic, our mission this past year continued to be challenged as never before, but our members and St. Thomas Aquinas parishioners stepped forward to meet the needs of our community. Contributions to our conference allowed us to distribute \$28,251.00 in assistance in 2021. SVdP volunteers conducted 44 home visits within our parish boundaries to provide material and spiritual support to our clients.

Thanks to your generosity and continued support, we were able to accomplish this and much more in 2021, including:

- The distribution of 75 Christmas, Easter and Thanksgiving "goodie bags" and \$100.00 grocery gift cards to families in our parish neighborhood
- Financial assistance to the Boulevard Place Food Pantry, which continued to serve clients while continuing its renovation/expansion
- Financial assistance to the Sunday Cathedral Soup Kitchen
- The distribution of grocery gift cards to clients during home visits throughout the year for the purchase of food and supplies The purchase of needed appliances and beds for clients
- Support of the SVdP Indianapolis Council annual "Struttin' Your Stuff" auction
- Financial support for our SVdP Twinning parish Consejo de Zena in the Dominican Republic
- Financial contributions to the SVdP USA Disaster Relief Program to assist victims of floods, hurricanes, tornadoes and wildfires
- Solidarity contributions to support the administration of the National Council of SVdP and the Indianapolis Council

None of these activities and accomplishments would have been possible without your support. As we begin the new year, many of our neighbors continue to experience great needs. We thank you again for your generosity and ask for your continued prayers for and financial support of our mission to serve the marginalized in our community in 2022.

As the letter indicates, all but one percent of donations go to Haiti; the one percent consists of bank wire -transfer fees. Again, thank you for your prayers and thank you for your heartfelt consideration of the good that is being done for the people of Belle-Rivière through your monetary support.

FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

"You are my beloved Son; with you I am well placed:" On Jan 19, 383, the Christian Roman Emperor Theodosius named his son Arcadius as co-emperor. It was during a period in church history when the Arian Heresy was spreading throughout the Roman Empire.

The Arian Heresy held that Jesus Christ was not fully God. Theodosius called for a truce between Christians and Arians and called for a conciliatory conference. One Christian bishop who was not willing to compromise his faith in Christ's deity was Amphilochus of Iconium. So he had to suffer persecution from the Arians.

On Arcadius' coronation day bishop entered the reception hall, bowed to the emperor, ignored his son and made a poignant speech and turned to leave. "What!" said Theodosius, "Do you take no notice of my son the co emperor? Is this all the respect you pay to a prince that I have made equal dignity with myself?"

At this the bishop gave Arcadius a blessing and replied, "Sir, do you so highly resent my apparent neglect of your son because I do not give him equal honor with yourself? What must the eternal God think of you, who have allowed His coequal and coeternal Son to be degraded in His proper divinity in every part of your empire? Remember God the father's proclamation on the day Jesus was baptized by John in the River Jordan."

The story of Jesus' baptism is another "showing," that is, another "epiphany," of God presenting Jesus to us. Jesus is revealed as God's beloved Son as the Holy Spirit comes upon him. St. Luke's story of Jesus' baptism is different in that nothing happens when Jesus is coming out of the water. Only when Jesus is praying after his baptism does the Holy Spirit come upon him and the Father's voice say, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" (Luke 3:22). From here on the Holy Spirit directs Jesus, leading him into the desert, then into his ministry of preaching, teaching, and healing.

Today's feast ends the Christmas season and next week Ordinary Time begins. The phrase Ordinary Time means numbered time. Often we might feel as though we are just counting the hours until the next big event or our next vacation. But the Spirit given to Jesus was given to us at our Baptism to help us continue our mission in the world and to assure us from within our hearts that we truly are God's beloved sons and daughters. Have you asked the Spirit, what God wants you to do at this time in your life?
