3RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In one of his books, David Buttrick tells about a cartoon in a magazine. The cartoon showed three men sitting in a row behind a long table. A microphone has been placed in front of each of them. One man was pictured in long flowing hair and a draped white robe. Another was battered, a wreath of jagged thorns on his head. The third was swarthy, with dark curly hair and a pointed nose. The caption said, "Will the real Jesus Christ please stand?"

Everybody sees Jesus from a different angle, including the writers of the New Testament. For Matthew, Jesus is the Teacher of Righteousness. For Mark, Jesus is an exorcist, constantly battling the powers of evil. Even after Evil nails him to a cross, Jesus emerges from the tomb to continue his saving work. But for Luke, the word that best summarizes the person and work of Jesus is the word "prophet."

In the story we heard today, Jesus is a different kind of prophet. The prophet Jesus says, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." When the prophet Jesus said, "Today the scripture is fulfilled," he turned memory into a mission statement. He transformed hope into an assignment. He claimed the beautiful poetry of Isaiah as his job description.

A hush must have fallen in the synagogue when Jesus walked forward to do the reading. This was his hometown; they all knew him. What would he choose to read? What would he say to them? They had been hearing about what he was doing--preaching about the kingdom of God being close enough to touch, the crowds coming to listen to him, the healings, the casting out of evil spirits. They were sitting on the edge of their seats.

He opened the scroll and went to the place in the book of the prophet Isaiah where an unknown speaker talks about being anointed by the Spirit of God and sent forth to do three things: to preach Good News, to liberate people who were imprisoned in any way, and to give sight to the blind. Then he looked at them and simply said: All this is happening now! The Isaiah reading continues to define the work of the Church: preaching the gospel, working for justice that frees people from oppression, and reaching out in compassion to all. The Holy Spirit is at work in and through us. How do you participate in this work?


