

Hello Friends,

I would like to wish you all a peaceful Easter. The Lord's love for us is renewed every morning (Lamentations 3:23). Let us try to experience that love each and every day.



We reflect on the Gospel according to John 20, the empty tomb and the appearance of Jesus to Mary Magdalene, the one who was by the cross along with Mother Mary and others during the passion and crucifixion (Jn; 19: 25). She cannot leave him after death. That is why she comes back to the tomb. The love that lasts even after the death (Jn: 20:11 16). She stays at the tomb crying. That's the

kind of love that helps us to experience the Risen Lord.


At the sight of an empty tomb Mary thinks that they have taken away the body of Jesus. But the reality was the resurrection. The things we see and the conclusions we come up with can be wrong. The truth can be something else. The divine interventions can be much greater. To experience that, we should have the willingness to stay around, wait and thirst for Jesus, like Mary did (Jn; 20:10 – 13). The one who seeks Him will find Him (Mt.7:8).

The Risen Lord is close to us and with us, even when we are worried and upset. All the events in the gospel after His resurrection proves that. Jesus appears to Mary Magdalene who was crying (Jh:20)). He walks with the frustrated disciples to Emmaus and opens their mind and hearts (Lk: 24). He instills hope in the disciples at Tiberius who worked so hard all through the night and had nothing (John: 21). These are just a few of the examples.

So let us believe that Jesus is there with us always. The faith and hope in the resurrection help us to go through the sufferings and crucifixion of our lives. Our hearts are broken as we watch the situations in Ukraine and the troubles in the entire world. He will listen to our cries if we call up on him and won't abandon us. Let that be our hope during this Easter season and the days ahead.


