Growing up in a home of three boys we were constantly looking into the fridge for something. I often remember my mother asking us boys what we were looking for and I would often answer, "I don't know." Much of our lives we spend looking for something we don't really know what it is or where to really look.

What do you want? This could be quite a simple question as well as a very complicated one. The desires of the heart can be very fleeting as well as very intentional. The question that prevails is not simply what do I want but where do I look to fulfill these desires. As we continue to navigate the challenging reality of our current environment, including COVID, I find it quite challenging to stay focused on not necessarily what it is that I truly desire but where best should I look to fulfill these desires.

In our Gospel, for the last weekend of the Christmas season, we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. Our Gospel begins with "the people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts". The question they were asking was, "who is the Christ" and they were looking to John the Baptist for the answers. His answer was simple, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire."

So often when looking for answers to the deepest movement of our hearts it is hard to humbly accept the direction and guidance from another and yet we are inspired by John the Baptist to look to another. I have always believed the Catholic faith is a humble faith. It requires always a willingness to surrender to, to look to another for the answers to our deepest questions, and where does the Church direct us for the answers, Christ? As we celebrate and renew our own commitments of baptism I invite us all to take time to ask, do I truly look to Christ for the answers to my desires, and do I trust the Church to direct me to Jesus.

For the people of Holy Rosary and the parish communities that attend Mass at Holy Rosary, I would like to humbly apologize for any inconvenience that closing the side doors has caused. The original intention was to encourage more community and intentional encounters as we worship together. However, I recognize through conversations with some parishioners that this has not been an easy change to accept. We will keep the side doors open at Holy Rosary church moving forward and look to other ways of encouraging intentional community as one body in Christ as we worship together.

I would like to bring attention to the new candlesticks that are on the Holy Rosary altar and recognize that Holy Rosary parish is celebrating 50 years of worship in our current church. The candlesticks were from the previous church building and through generous parishioners, they were given back to the parish and refinished. Please look forward to many ways we will be celebrating these 50 years including renewing our worship space. If you do have ownership of any items from the previous church please let the office know, there may be a use for them in our space in the future.

May the baptism of our Lord always inspire us to an openness to Christ and the truth of the Church.

I Hope I Am Like Him

"Who is this Christ? Is he like you?"

Perhaps you've heard this story, often attributed to the life of St. Teresa of Calcutta. A sick man asked her this question, as he marveled at her tireless service to himself and others in the name of someone named Jesus Christ.

"He is nothing like me," the saint is said to have answered. "But I hope I am like him."

Though the authenticity of this exchange cannot be verified, its message rings perfectly true: all the value of our stewardship lies in its relativity to the one in whose name we perform it.

Consider the figure of John the Baptist — a magnificent, towering character even purely from a literary or historical perspective. A martyr who fed on wild locusts and boldly spoke truth to power — a man so great some mistook him for the Messiah.

But why is he great? Because he prepared the way. All his accomplishments and escapades mean nothing if they are taken out of the context of salvation history. He only makes sense relative to Christ — and this is exactly as he wanted it. "One worthier than I is coming," he insists. And because of that humility and that total embrace of God's will, he is given one of the greatest honors in the New Testament — he baptizes the Son of God.

Let's examine our lives in the light of their relativity to Christ. How do we prepare the way? When Christ comes to us, what do we do? How do we leave ourselves open to be actors in God's plan? ~ Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS


