DEAR PARISHIONERS,

The gospel reading this weekend directs our minds immediately to the Visitation of Mary to Elizabeth. In our faith tradition, this particular scene serves as one of the joyful mysteries and it signifies a family reunion of sorts. Two cousins come together in a time of great anticipation. Mary signifies the new generation bringing forth a new covenant. She is the bearer of the Word made flesh, the Son of God. Elizabeth signifies the older generation who is the bearer of the final prophet, John the Baptist, who serves as the bridge to the new promise.

There is theological significance within the setting of the Visitation. There is also much physical and emotional reaction within this encounter of the new and virgin Mary and the old and once barren woman, Elizabeth. The gospel of Luke relates, "When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice..." From the moment that Mary's greeting reached Elizabeth's ears, the infant, John the Baptist, joyfully leapt in her womb.

This Visitation is one of great comfort and one of kindred spirits. Both Mary and Elizabeth impart blessings and offer canticles of praise to God. And, as the gospel relates Mary remained with Elizabeth for about three months.

Not all visitations go that well nor are they all as enthusiastic. Perhaps within our own experience of visitations around the Christmas Season the reality of stress overpowers the joy and the chaos trumps the comfort. Some say that houseguests are like fish – they go bad after three days. Some folks can't image housing someone for three months like Elizabeth did with Mary.

Thirty-two years ago, in 1989, a Christmas movie was produced that I think speaks about the theme of Visitation on a more somber note during the Holiday Season. This film is the third in a series of four which features an unusual but famous family named the Griswold's who are the main characters in National Lampoon's Christmas Vacation.

Since its release in 1989, Christmas Vacation has been ranked on many top 10 favorite Christmas film lists and is considered a modern holiday classic. It has been on the television a number of times already and I would be surprised if you haven't seen it.

It features a modern-day family of four from the suburbs of Chicago (Clark, Ellen, Audrey and Russ). Clark is an idealistic yet gullible family man who sets very high expectations for himself. In the film there are **four distinct visitations** that contribute to the downward spiral leading to the disaster of the fun filled, old fashioned family Christmas that Clark Griswold has dreamed of for his family.

A few days before Christmas, the many members of Clark's extended family begin arriving to stay with him. And, it is the first sound that reaches their ears that should have been an indication of the impending disaster of this visitation. Clark's and Ellen's outspoken and obnoxious parents are the first to arrive. When they ring the door bell it comes across as a somber and ominously descending death toll. In this scene, at that moment, before they opened the door to greet the extended family, everyone in the house paused and appeared to do a "gut-check." Rather than leaping for joy as does John the Baptist in the womb of Elizabeth, these characters appear as though they would rather run for cover.

Shortly thereafter and secondly, Ellen's cousin-in-law and cousin, Eddie and Catherine, along with their children and dog unexpectedly show up and threaten to stay with them for a month, with their dilapidated, rusty RV parked in the driveway the whole time.

Thirdly, on Christmas Eve, the family's eldest members, cynical, cigar-smoking Uncle Lewis and confused Aunt Bethany, arrive for dinner. Numerous disasters occur that evening: The turkey is cooked for far too long; the aunt's cat is electrocuted when it chews on a strand of Christmas lights and the tree goes up in flames.

Finally, a delayed delivery from the company arrives at the door that evening. Clark expects it to be the long-awaited bonus that he plans to use to put in a pool at his house. Unfortunately, Clark's boss cut out bonuses without informing his employees. As a substitute, Clark is enrolled in the "Jelly of the Month" club which Eddie proudly proclaims as "the gift that keeps on giving." Clark has now reached his boiling point, going through several outbursts out of severe frustration.

However, all is well that ends well in this saga of humorous highs and lows within the Griswold family. Although the house is virtually destroyed, the work bonus is restored and the family is reunited in good spirits for a happy ending and a Merry Christmas after all those visitations.

This fourth Sunday of Advent is also a time of Visitation. As people of faith we focus not so much on the story of the Griswold's visitations nor of our own family visitations but really, we focus on the family encounter in the Visitation of Mary and Elizabeth. As a faith family, we are called to embrace their enthusiasm and rejoice in their good news. We are encouraged to do a gutcheck when we hear the words of scripture and the sounds of the season. Do they cause our insides to leap for joy and make ready our hearts for Jesus who is better than any bonus check we could ever imagine?

As we prepare our hearts and homes for Christmas with open arms to family and friends we should make sure, even more so, that we are opening our hearts and homes for Jesus. We should be more inclined to enter into the Christmas season and greet Him by responding with a joyful and uplifting noise rather than reacting to a doorbell that emits the sound of a somber and ominously descending death toll. Don't run for cover, but rather, Rejoice in the Lord!


