**Pray for Vocations****DEAR PARISHIONERS,**

The scripture readings for this weekend have much to do with the whole notions of being taken and told; being chosen and called; being summoned and sent forth to do the work of the Lord.

We heard about Amos, the Old Testament prophet, who was a shepherd and a tree trimmer. He was taken and told by God to be a prophet in Israel. We heard St. Paul's teaching as he informs the Ephesians that, "God chose us...before the foundation of the world...to be holy and without blemish." St. Paul reminds the Ephesians, who were not all that pious and pure, that God has chosen them and called them to a life of holiness. They are to go forth with a firm purpose to offer praise to God. The gospel of Mark is also a clear depiction of being summoned and sent forth as we heard Jesus sending out his apostles "the Twelve" to be instruments of his message and witnesses of this call to a transformed life.

All of these biblical figures: Amos, Paul and the Twelve were outsiders entering into communities that were not immediately receptive to these men and the message that they conveyed.

The Good News for us to reflect upon today and every day is that God continues to call us out of the ordinary, the mundane, and the usual to do something extraordinary with our lives.

God summons us, we who are not always that pious and pure, and sends us forth to live lives of holiness and challenge others to do the same. We are all called to be continuously transformed by God's grace and we are sent forth with a firm purpose in this life. We need to be reminded of that "firm purpose" which is to glorify the name of the Lord above all else and incorporate the love of God in all that we think, do and say.

This is not an easy task. It takes dedication, devotion, commitment and openness to the never-ending process of conversion of being formed by our faith. But most of all, it takes the constant process of emptying ourselves so that we might be filled with the spirit of God.

The real danger we face today in preaching the Word of God is complacency and minimalism. Most people don't like being called out of the ordinary. Most people don't like to be transformed or changed especially when these invitations come from outsiders.

We like things just the way they are. We think that everything is okay and that we don't need growth, change or improvement. You may be sitting there right now thinking to yourself, "I'm alright, I fulfill my obligations. I come to church regularly, sit in the same pew and do my private devotions. That should be good enough to squeak by." Well, that may be good, but it is not enough.

The prophet Amos, St. Paul and the Twelve dealt with that same mentality in the communities to which they were sent. The Israelites, as a prosperous nation, were growing complacent in their faith. They were practicing injustice and participating in idolatry. Amos was sent as a prophet to turn them around and straighten them up by calling them back to the high moral standards and to avoid religious minimalism.

The Ephesians were still a young community, in a state of complacency, with some questions and doubts about the significance of their faith. They wondered how they should put it to practice. St. Paul wrote them a letter, as a pastor and teacher, to offer them understanding and guidance in their faith.

The Twelve were sent off to specifically preach repentance and announce the reign of God. Undoubtedly, they were going to be met with complacency as Jesus instructed them, "Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them."

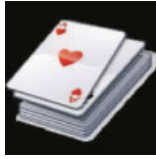
Complacency and minimalism remain with us today as we continue to practice injustice and participate in idolatry. Many people, often times, do not welcome and do not listen to the Word of God and the call to repentance. If

During Advent and Christmas Season we usually sing the Mass of Christ the Savior by Dan Schutte, and for the last couple of years we returned to the Mass of Spirit and Grace by Ricky Manalo, OSP. 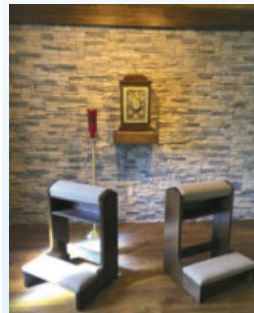
Upcoming Liturgical Events/Training/ Special Masses

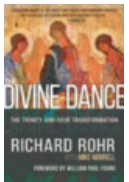

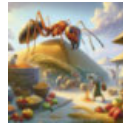
