

### DEAR PARISHIONERS...

On this Labor Day weekend, which often marks the end of summer, we take a welcome rest from our labors. Whether that be in a factory or field, store or office, school or home, we take time out for the one who promised that his yoke is easy and his burden light. Let us pray especially for those whose own burden is difficult, those who need to work more than one job to support their families, those who do not receive the gratitude and compensation they deserve for their work, and those who are unemployed or underemployed.

It is noteworthy that the first words the deaf and mute man in the Gospel hears presumably in his entire life were the words of Jesus. His ears have been opened to hear God's words and his tongue loosened to proclaim God's good news. At our baptism there is the Ephphatha rite that recalls this event. The priest or deacon touches the ears and mouth of the child saying, "The Lord Jesus made the deaf hear and the mute speak. May he soon touch your ears to receive His word, and your mouth to proclaim His faith, the praise and glory of God the Father." By virtue of our baptism, we are all this man, touched by God's grace and made ready to speak God's Word to the world.

### **GROWING FAITH**

It is so good to see our numbers at the weekend Masses growing each month. What a blessing to worship our risen Savior together in person with the proclaimed Word, prayers, and music each week. The Eucharist is, after all, "the source and summit" of our life as Catholics.

No doubt most parishioners have received their vaccinations, which makes our 'live' gatherings so much safer and more comfortable for all in attendance.

Please know that the Archdiocese has directed each parish at this time to follow the guidelines from the area in which they are located, so we are following the City of Franklin. Our Director of Religious Education, Mary Jo Hennemann, is choosing to follow the stricter guidelines of the

CDC for those involved in the Family Faith Formation Program since those aged under 12 years cannot be vaccinated at this time.

Final food for thought: Jason T. Eberl and Tobias Winright, both professors of Health Care Ethics at St. Louis University, say that there is no sufficient moral reason for Catholics to request an exemption from vaccination policies for COVID-19. In fact, as Pope Francis has affirmed. there may be a moral obligation to be vaccinated unless one has a medical condition that dictates otherwise. They go on to say, "COVID-19 vaccination is thus an appropriate means of fulfilling our moral obligation to promote the common good."

Bottom line: Let's do our very best to look out for one another during these very challenging times.


