

FROM THE DESK OF

Deacon Tom Tomaszewski

What is the best advice you've ever gotten, that you should have taken but didn't? A middle school student once gave me what I think is the perfect answer to that question. He said the best advice he had ever gotten that he should have taken but didn't take was, "Don't do that!"

When Mary first approaches Jesus in today's Gospel to tell him that the wedding is out of wine, His response is "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." Do you think you could have gotten away with that answer? Try it the next time your wife or mother asks you to do something. When she says, "take out the garbage" just respond with "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." See how that works out for you.

Mary gives us the best advice any of us can ever get; but, it is often not taken. She tells the wine servers to "Do whatever He tells you." It is the last thing Mary is quoted as saying in the Bible. "Do whatever He tells you."

Jesus' response is actually an acknowledgement of something that should be very precious to you and me. With the words, "Woman, how does vour concern affect me? Mv hour has not yet come," and then His performing the miracle of turning water into wine, Jesus reveals the power of Mary's gentle faithful intercession. Mary can change Jesus' mind.

The result, as know from the story of the Wedding at Cana, is



that Jesus turns a bad situation around. He turns worse into better. He turns empty into full. He turns common everyday water used to wash hands and feet into the best sweetest most satisfying wine anyone has ever tasted, and He shocks the people at the wedding because this best is saved till last.

Mary doesn't say anything else to Jesus, instead she addressed the servers saying, "Do whatever He tells you." Mary has to convince the servers to follow Jesus commands. But, she is speaking to us at the same time. When our faith has run out and our hearts are emptied of joy by the things of this world; Jesus can turn bad into better. hopeless into hopeful and emptiness into the sweet grace of His love overflowing and abundant. He keeps the best for last. When we die we are promised something more beautiful that we can ever imagine.

We need only follow Mary's advice, "Do whatever He tells you."


