

From the Pastor

The staff of St. Francis Parish wish you and your loved ones the blessings of this Christmas season! We all know it is a Christmas season like none other, but we are glad and happy that we were able to come to Mass for Christmas Eve or Christmas morning. I know I will never forget Easter of this year when the church was empty for Holy Week, the Sacred Triduum, the Easter Vigil and Masses on Easter morning. For our Christmas Masses we had our quota for safe attendance, 25% of the capacity, for all of our Masses.

I thank Barb Runde, Lenora Drees, and Mary Waldhoff who came and helped Anita and Jane, with organizing the attendance at all the Masses. They took the phone calls, and they put up with an attitude that they should not have had to deal with. They were doing their jobs the best they could, and it was something no one else would want to do. We are grateful to them for going the extra mile to try to appease our parishioners.

And we are all grateful to the members of the Art and Environment Committee for the work they did in making our church so beautiful with all the decorations, the trees and lights, flowers and statues. We have a beautiful church, and our A and E Committee makes the church even more attractive.

In this "covid age" we all miss the songs that we are accustomed to singing especially during the Christmas season. We are grateful to Dan Williams, our organist and Director of Music, as well as the members of the choirs, guitar group and cantors for all the time our musicians and singers have put into practice and leading us in song to raise our spirits to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

With the extra Masses for Christmas, liturgical ministers had to step up and minister where God has gifted them to serve: Eucharistic ministers, readers, ushers, to name a couple. Some day we will have servers or acolytes back on the altar.

Part of our Christmas celebration for several years is the Giving Tree, and we thank Lisa Siemer and Karen Pruemer for again stepping up to the plate with organizing and executing the project. They'd be the first to say that it takes a lot of people, and they're glad everyone joins in. 300 people had a more joyful Christmas this year because of you, the parishioners. Thank you for your generosity and sense of stewardship.

We extend our sympathy and condolences to the family of Roger Borries, who was buried from St. Francis on Friday, 18 December. I understand he worked on building the grottos we have here on the property, like the altars that grace both sides of the front entrance to our church. Many of his Saturdays were spent laying stone and planning and building the altars and grottos. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord.

Shortly before the Confirmation Mass of our 9th graders on Thursday, 17 December, a camera was installed on the second pillar of the church on the east side. Tony Runde and Gabe Rauch did much of the wiring and figuring out how to make it all happen. Streaming the Mass, and having the Mass available later "on demand" via you-tube, will make it possible for many parishioners to stay connected to the liturgical life of our parish. Tony and Gabe saved the parish a good deal of funds. If anyone would like to contribute to the cost of the camera and hook-up materials, you are certainly welcome to pitch in. I think this will be used for many years to come.

Beginning in the new year we will have baptisms at St. Francis on two weekends each month, the 2nd and the 4th weekend. They can be after either the evening Mass or the morning Mass. Please keep this in mind for your planning. I like to have a maximum of two families per baptism. Otherwise it gets a little "busy" near the font.

I ask a prayerful remembrance from you for my sister, who has ovarian cancer in its 4th stage. Her name is Joanne Randles, and she lives with her family in Buffalo, New York. There were 4 children in my family, and now Ma and Dad and the two older ones have been embraced by Sister Death. I feel sort of sorry for Joanne because she and Ma were very close, and she can't talk all this stuff over with Ma. Thank you for your prayers for Joanne. She and Larry have 3 children and 3 grandchildren.




Solemnity of Mary New Year's Day Mass at 9:00 am

GOSPEL MEDITATION The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Tragedy and disappointment are inevitable. What sees you through this? There will be challenges, changes, unexpected circumstances, interrupted plans, hurts, and injustices experienced by every human being at some point in their lives. We will be asked to adjust our plans, change course, and even encounter suffering and death. Where do we learn all of the lessons we need to



live life well? Some of them we learn along the way but much of what we bring to life, positive and negative, comes from our early beginnings, our families. This is our early world and provides the blueprint for how we see the bigger, more inclusive world, which unfolds before us.

Our families of origin can be sources of grace, heartache or a combination of both. Families are intended to be pivotal in providing us with proper social structure and understanding, a support system, lessons about relationships and communication, and the unconditional acceptance and love we so desperately crave. They can also determine whether we have an accessible and healthy relationship with God. Many of life's challenges can literally bring us to our knees and require that we possess a strength of character that resides well beyond the superficialities of our world. At some point we will all need three coping gifts that can be given to us only by God: faith, hope, and love. Our families help us learn that we are not the ones responsible for their creation, but God!

Our experience of early family life colors all of our relationships and what we expect to achieve from life in general. Resolving conflicts, dealing with difficulty and suffering, celebrating accomplishments, prioritizing our needs, listening to God's call, understanding relationships, understanding disappointment, learning about the virtues and living a centered focused life are all lessons our families either succeed in teaching or do not. To succeed, as God has designed and ordered our world, is to discover his presence and then trust that Presence. The Holy Family can teach even the most dysfunctional family how to best use God's gifts of faith, hope, and love to find him and do his will. Their simple humble example is always before us, showing us the way. Jesus, Mary and Joseph, pray for us!

Annual Catholic Services Appeal (ACSA) transitioning to Parish Community Tithe

This year we begin the transition from the ACSA appeal to the Parish Tithe. The funds received through the tithe will be used for the support and services provided by the diocese, in the same way that ACSA funds supported the diocese. This year the change is the calculation used by the diocese. The amount our parish is expected to tithe is 10% of our annual church income. Capital campaign income is not included in the calculation. Our parish tithing goal for this year is \$77,199.

Parishioners can donate directly to the Parish Tithe fund in the same manner we have in the past for ACSA. You can send your donation directly to the diocese, or donate through our online system, or you can drop it in the collection box and the parish staff will forward the funds to the diocese. When writing your check make it out to "Diocese Parish Tithe" and write St. Francis Teutopolis in the memo line. The tithing contribution can be in place of your weekly contributions to the parish. The funds that are donated directly to the Parish Tithe are not included in the tithe calculation.

If you have donated to ACSA through the summer and already this fall, these funds will be posted against our tithe goal for this year by the diocese.
