

#### From The Pastor

Thank you for praying that I have a safe trip while on vacation. Your prayers are appreciated, and there was only one snag in the 2,500 miles I drove: on I-24, just west of Nashville I had a flat tire. No accident. No one injured. It was just an inconvenience. I can testify that those small emergency tires in the trunk can travel more than 50 miles!

Thank you also for your prayers for my sister, Joanne. She is 75, and her husband, Larry, is 80. Joanne had ovarian cancer, and we want to believe that she is now cancer free, but they are recommending a check up every 3 months. Prayer is powerful, and we never know who is praying for us.

When I arrived in Chesapeake, VA to stay with Ron and P.J. (a retired Navy nurse), I found out we were going to travel to a place on the water for supper that evening. We picked up a friend of Ron and P.J.'s, A. J. is her name. I had Mass on another visit years ago for A.J.'s husband, who ended up dying from MLS. The Mass was at Ron and P.J.'s house, and there were several people there. One of the guests was the mother of A.J. When Ron, P.J., A. J. and I (call me F.J.) went out for supper, A.J. told me that her mother has prayed for me every day since that Mass several years ago! I was blown away! I doubt she would recognize me, and I honestly don't know her, but she has prayed for me every day. How kind, generous and loving is that! We don't know the names and faces of those who lift us up in prayer. A lady here in our parish wrote me that she has been praying for my sister in her daily rosary. Touching. We don't know the power of prayer.

Also in Chesapeake, VA one evening I visited the couple who were my last wedding at the Norfolk naval base chapel in 2000. Now they have six children! They had just returned from a drive to Texas for a wedding. They have a van that is very large. And they're talking like possibly coming to Illinois next summer. They are a delight.

In Fredericksburg, VA I stayed 4 nights with a retired Marine and his wife. He continues to work for the government after retirement, and this is quite common. He and Terri have 8 children, 2 cats, a dog and chickens. There is always someone coming and going!

On the way home I stopped at Smokey Mountain Park. It is good for the soul to stop and enjoy the beauty of God's work in our world. St. Francis or St. Bonaventure called nature the vestigia Dei – the footprints of God. So true. We don't have to travel far to see God's footprints – a beautiful sunrise over a field of maturing corn can yield an experience of God's love for us.

I was going to stay for a night or two at San Damiano Retreat Center down along the Ohio River, but they were all booked by the time I called for a reservation. I can go there some other time; it is much closer than North Carolina or Tennessee!

Coming our way is the feast of Our Lady of the Angels of the Portiuncula on the second of August. If you look at the mural above the arch of our sanctuary you can see St. Francis receiving permission for the indulgence. It used to be a requirement that the person had to pray in a church where the Franciscans were responsible for the community. But we can pray in any church and gain the Portiunulca indulgence. Requirements are: celebration of the sacrament of Penance, participation in the Holy Eucharist; praying for the intention of the Holy Father, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and Holy Communion is received. The unusual name is Italian and means: the little portion.

St. Francis told the friars, his followers, to not own any property because you will have to defend it. But, he said: don't give up the little chapel that the Benedictines have allowed the friars to use for their prayer and worship. The little chapel is very close to the town of Assisi. The followers of St. Francis kept the little chapel. In fact, they built a huge basilica over the little chapel!!! I don't think St. Francis had this in mind!

#### INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

God calls us to bring His Word to all corners of the earth. What does that mean for you and me? We are just simple and humble folks trying to find our way through the Gospel and our world. After all, we are not professional preachers but gentle servants. Jesus summons us to take his message on the road and bring it from the pew to the pavement. We cannot keep the joy of the Gospel to ourselves but must bring it into every aspect of our lives: our families, our schools, our work, our corporations, our politics, our social circles, and our philosophies. We cannot just accept the wisdom of the world as true and conduct our lives as if the Good News is a separate matter. They are one. Jesus never asked his friends to go and construct buildings where people could come to hear the truth. He asked them to go to their homes and meet them one on one, face to face. When the rubber meets the road and the message is challenging, rejection is quite possible. That's the litmus test for whether we're really doing what we have been asked.

The Annual Catholic Services Appeal (ACSA) no longer exists. The Diocesan Parish Tithe (DPT) Appeal no longer exists. You will not receive an appeal letter, nor will there be a parish goal. The final change is now.

Starting July 2021, parishes will support the Diocese of Springfield mission and ministry offices through a monthly tithe (10%) from parish support. The parishes will pay the tithe directly to the diocese. An individual may choose to continue supporting the Bishop's Gift Society or a particular diocesan ministry office, however these donations are not credited back to the parish in any manner. All second collections will remain in place.

The ACSA/DPT collection option set up with WeShare (the online giving service used by St. Francis parish), has been deactivated. The online givers from St. Francis parish will not have to adjust that donation. The option has been eliminated. If they so choose to donate those funds to the general collection or a second collection, the online giver will need to log in to their WeShare account to make the adjustments.

If you have an online contributions for ACSA/DPT set up with the Diocese of Springfield directly and would like to make an adjustment, you may do so by logging in to your account with the diocese or by emailing Katie Price kprice@dio.org with your name, parish, and address to complete the request. Any donations made to the diocese through their online giving system will support the diocese and the donations are not credited back to the parish in any manner.
