

From the Pastor

The parishioners extend our condolences and sympathies to the families of Bruce Weber and Larry Budde. Bruce was buried from our church this past Thursday, and Larry's burial was Friday morning. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord.

The feast of St. Francis of Assisi is October 4th, Monday. We will have the blessing of animals this Sunday afternoon at 1 o'clock in front of the grotto, near the grade school. It is traditional to have the Transitus ceremony on the vigil of the Saint's feast day, so we will celebrate the Transitus at 6 o'clock Sunday evening in church. After the Transitus, all are invited to come to the friary for a social visit. Mass on his feast day is at 9:00 am.

During the Convocation last week, we priests would gather at a different church each morning for Mass and morning prayer, which were combined. It was interesting to see and visit the different churches. I think it was Sts. Peter and Paul Church in Collinsville that had photos of couples on both side walls of the church, and the pictures were separated by years. One section, for example was 1980, so I presume the couples in their wedding attire, were married at some point during that decade. And the same for 1990, 2000 and so on. I've never seen that before in a church. There were no names.

I am glad to see more people wearing masks for the weekday Masses. This isn't going to change overnight. I did some business in O'Fallon before going to the Convocation, and wherever I went people automatically had their masks on – whether it was a grocery store, a bank, restaurant, you name it. There was no question: am I going to wear a mask? You and everyone else, wore a mask if you were going to do business in that establishment. Look around here, and what do we see? Over there, you could see the community is dealing with a problem. In Effingham County, by contrast, we walk around with our heads in the sand. It is almost like a form of denial – what pandemic? Is there a virus going around? I'm curious to see if we have a growing number of people wearing masks for the weekend Masses. It's only 45 minutes. I doubt very many of us want to go back to closed churches and watching Mass at home on a screen. And we would like to get together with family for Christmas without fearing whether or not someone in the family has the COVID. Let's be smart and prudent.



St. Francis of Assisi Feast Day October 4

St. Francis of Assisi (1181 – 1226) left a life of luxury for a life devoted to Christianity after reportedly hearing the voice of God, who commanded him to rebuild the Christian church and live in poverty. He founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, the women's Order of St. Clare, the Third Order of St. Francis and the Custody of the Holy Land.

Born in 1181 in Italy, St. Francis of Assisi was renowned for drinking and partying as a youth. During a military expedition/battle between Assisi and Perugia, he was captured and imprisoned for ransom. He

spent nearly a year in prison and began receiving visions from God. After his release from prison, St. Francis of Assisi claimed to have heard the voice of Christ, who told him to restore the Christian Church and live a life of poverty. As a result, St. Francis of Assisi abandoned his life of luxury and became a devotee of the Catholic faith.

Today, St. Francis of Assisi, known for his deep love of nature and animals, is the patron saint of the environment and animals. Each October, many animals are blessed on his feast day.


