

From the Pastor

In my homilies at the Masses last weekend I encouraged you to "save the date" for the next Penance Service, which will be this Tuesday evening at 7 o'clock. There won't be a Penance Service per se, but there will be 3 priests to hear the confessions of those ready to confess. Fr. Sunder Ery, the pastor from St. Michael's in Sigel, will



assist your parish priests so that you won't have to wait an excessive amount of time.

The next evening, 15 December, our high school students will have the opportunity to receive the sacrament, and this time Fr. Michal Rosa, the pastor of Sacred Heart Parish in Effingham, will be assisting your parish priests.

If it has been some time since your last confession – like years – resolve now to change that. Just tell the priest it has been some time, and you would like his help. He will be happy to assist you.

Our men showed up last Saturday morning and worked to unload the truck and assemble the stage for the play Maximilian. After the performance, another group of young men came and took down the curtains and lights and speakers and loaded the truck. The morning crew and evening crew did an outstanding job – thank you, Gentlemen. I know Larry and Darlene Hardiek are very proud of their sons and grandsons while Joan Smith is also proud of her sons as well. Those are the families, and there were a couple individuals, who helped.

Unfortunately, the attendance was low, under 100 people. And the collection didn't come close to covering the cost of the performance and the advertising – you might have seen the ads in the diocesan newspaper. These publicity costs are being divided among the 5 parishes that hosted the play – parishes from Quincy to Troy to Teutopolis to Mattoon to Vandalia. It was a very good play. One thing I came away with was the strength of St. Maximilian's faith. If you were going to discuss your belief system, what would you say? I don't mean going through the Creed like we do at Mass, but for whom or for what would you be willing to die for? That is really what it comes out to. 



St. Lucy |Feast Day December 13

A name that means "light," St. Lucy (283 – 304) is the patron saint of those blind or suffering with eye trouble. Not much is known about her life, except that she was determined to remain a virgin and thus refused marriage. History tells the story of a frustrated suitor who eventually accused St. Lucy of being a Christian (a crime at the time), and she was executed in Syracuse, Sicily, in the year 304.

Today, we celebrate a number of traditions that incorporate symbolic meaning of St. Lucy as the "bearer" of

light in the darkness of winter. This is particularly seen in Scandinavian countries, with their long dark winters. There, a young girl dressed in a white dress and a red sash (as the symbol of martyrdom) carries palms and wears a crown or wreath of candles on her head. In Denmark, Norway and Sweden, girls dressed as Lucy carry rolls and cookies in procession as songs are sung.


