From the Pastor

The parishioners extend our condolences and sympathy to the family of C. Michael Hewing, whose funeral is this Monday morning at 10:30. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord.

Monday, 28 February, is a day of mixed emotions for the parishioners of St. Francis. On the one hand, we join Jane Miller in celebrating 23 years of faithful and dedicated service to the parish and to the friars. "Commendable job" doesn't begin to describe what she has accomplished for the parish. It's time for something new and different for Jane. Now she can join her husband, Dennis, as they retire. So there's a good deal to celebrate, and we thank God for Jane and all she has done for the parish. On the other hand, we are sad to see her move on. She has been so dependable and reliable, hardworking and competent, always willing to help, and I will miss her smile. Dennis and Jane belong to St. Rose Parish, so she is not going far away. Thank you, Jane, for all you have accomplished and for your willingness to pitch in and help.

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the start of Lent. Although it is not a holy day of obligation, many people come to Mass on Ash Wednesday. (There are 6 holy days in the year.) We have Masses on this Wednesday at 6:00 am, and there will be a crowd. 12:10 will have large attendance also. And we have Mass at 7:00 in the evening. Montrose also has a 7:00 pm Mass. We also have a Communion Service with distribution of ashes at 8:00 am. Some children will attend this, and other children will receive and be marked with ashes in their classrooms. During Lent we will have the Stations of the Cross on each Friday at 7 o'clock.

Ash Wednesday is a day of FAST AND ABSTINENCE. All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence. Fasting means no eating between meals, and we are allowed one large meal – the other two small meals combined should not equal the one large meal. This applies to people aged 18-59. Abstinence applies to people over 14 years old, and it means we do not eat meat. These dietary requirements are only basic and minimal for us Catholics, and they are serious. To know and completely disregard is confession material. Develop your Lenten plan so that you can continue some positive, healthy, holy activity in your life after we celebrate Easter. A note about the dietary requirements, the presumption is that one is healthy! If you are ill and under doctor's care, God expects you to use your good judgment.

Our plan for Lent should include the three pillars: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. It's only 40 days.

Next weekend we will hear from Kent Probst and Karen Smith, representatives serving on the board of Catholic Charities. Kent will speak at 3 of our Masses, and Karen will speak at one Mass, plus the two Masses at St. Rose Parish. Please be generous in your helping the poor in our community.

I joined the RCIA people last Sunday for a pilgrimage to St. Mary of the Woods. If you haven't been there, it is certainly worth the trip, and it isn't far at all. It's an easy day trip, but travel there on a pleasant day so you can walk around the grounds. The complex has 1,200 acres! You will need to walk if you go over in time to eat at their buffet! It's quite the spread.

Lenten Regulations

- 1. ABSTINENCE Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. FAST Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.
- To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
