From the Pastor

During this month of September we resume the opportunity for the sacrament of reconciliation on weekday evenings from 6:15 to 6:45 on Tuesday and Thursday each week. This begins this week, 6 September.

Also this month our annual picnic takes place. It happens on Saturday, 17 September. We will start with Mass at 4 o'clock, and it will be outside near the white crucifix in the mini park. Bring your lawn chair. Our guitar group will lead us in song. Please note: there will NOT be confessions at 3 o'clock that day.

I don't know if you have purchased your chance to win at the golf ball drop. The idea is that if we sell out, there will be 500 golf balls dropped from a helicopter, and the closest ball to the pin wins \$2,000.00! Whatever number of golf balls sold will be dropped; there won't be more than 500 sold. I would like to see two or three golf ball drops!! 
