# From the Pastor

I mentioned in last week's bulletin that I would be meeting with my nephew for the first time this week, but that didn't happen. Had my ticket for the train in hand; had a reservation for a room at St. Peter's in the loop for a couple of nights; my nephew and I decided on which restaurant we would have supper at. Then the plans fell apart when I fell apart. It's unfortunate, but what are you going to do? We will meet some time in the future.

Tomorrow, Monday, we have our Eucharistic Day of Prayer for Life. The monstrance we will use for the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is the one I have written about here before – the monstrance that is making its way around the parishes in the diocese. It was purchased by the Catholic community in Quincy in honor of the bishop of Alton. So this monstrance is old, and who knows how many times it has been used for adoration and benediction ... all over the diocese! Our Prayer for Life will continue either in the side chapel or stay in the church, depending on the number of people who come to pray. Many people in the diocese have been blessed with the Blessed Sacrament carried in this monstrance. Continue praying for Life.

There will be a collection taken up during our Holy Thursday liturgy, and this collection will be presented to the El Shaddai organization. The El Shaddai group helps young mothers in need of guidance. If they need medical help with delivery of a child, or after care, or getting their education up to speed – it is a beneficial organization and is very pro-life. It is located on Temple in the old Brookstone Suites building. It is just getting started here in Effingham, so they can certainly use our help.

The collection gathered on Good Friday always goes to the Holy Land to help the people there maintain the sacred sites.

You have noticed the lit crucifixion above our high altar. With all the lights on in the church, the illumination gets somewhat washed out. However, when the church is darker, the crucifixion stands out. Eric Habing has contributed his time and treasure to making this happen, and our Ron Ruholl put in several hours. Eric did not get a great deal of enthusiasm from me about the project, and I'm still not sure if it enhances our spiritual space. When it is dark in church, the crucifixion really stands out. For me, the jury is still out, but our liturgy committee said they liked it, and the parish council seemed to be in favor.

Remember our Penance Service is this Tuesday, 28 March, at 7:00 p.m. It's not a real service, but there will be ample opportunity for you to go to confession. Bring the family! Children will always remember seeing their father or mother going to confession.


# 84th Annual Teutopolis Easter Egg Hunt


