From the Pastor

It isn't often for the Diocese of Springfield to not have a Mass on a Saturday evening in any church in the diocese! This is what is happening this weekend. As you know, for months the diocese has been talking about the Eucharistic Congress at the Bank of Springfield Convention Center on October 28th. Parishes were not allowed to schedule weddings or Masses on this day so people would be free to attend and participate in the Eucharistic Congress. Many people have given a good deal of their time to work on this, and I'm sure it will be very worthwhile.

This weekend, on Sunday October 29, we have our Mass of Remembrance at 6:00 p.m. At this Mass we remember in a special way the members of our parish who have died in the past year. Sharon Brummer has composed a pictorial summary of each of the deceased and a copy of their obituary. These papers are in the front of church. Thank you, Sharon. It's a great idea. You have probably seen the easels holding them when you came forward for receiving the Eucharist.

Holy Day of Obligation is this Wednesday, November 1st, the feast of All Saints. We have only a half dozen of these holy days of obligation in a year. Come and celebrate the Eucharist. We have 4 Masses on the feast: 6:00 a.m. note the change in time. Our usual time for the first Mass is 6:30, but we realize people have to get to work, so this Mass starts at 6:00. Then we have 7:55 a.m.; 12:10 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. So there is something for everyone!

The next day, November 2nd, is the Feast of All Souls. We have Masses at 6:30 and 8:00. I would think that this day would be the Holy Day of Obligation so all the Catholics would come to Mass and pray for the souls in purgatory. But I think the saints in heaven gather around the altars during the Eucharist, and they do all they can to help the poor souls.

November 2nd is also the date I hopefully get "cleared" by my surgeon so there will not be any restrictions. I won't have to wear that black vest, can lift more than 15 pounds, and other stuff. I suspect he is going to have some suggestions for me to avoid messing up the 5 screws he put into my spine. I'll be surprised if he doesn't clear me. Thank you for your prayers on my behalf. They have worked. No one said anything to me about physical therapy so I got things moving on that several days ago. I can see the difference already.

Last Sunday afternoon our CCW sponsored the "Where's Padre? The Great Picture Hunt." There were golf carts all over our metropolitan area! Thanks to Jodie Pruemer and her team for working on this. I wasn't able to solve very many puzzles.

The Teutopolis Civic Club hosted the Halloween Parade on Friday. The children I am sure had a great time. And the same group, Civic Club, was instrumental in having the 10:30 Mass last Sunday honoring the members of the First Responders. There was a standing ovation, that lasted a long time, for these brave folks, who go into harm's way. It spoke a great deal of the community's gratitude and appreciation for all that our First Responders do. And thank you, Civil Club members, for all you do.


